- take part in peaceful protest.

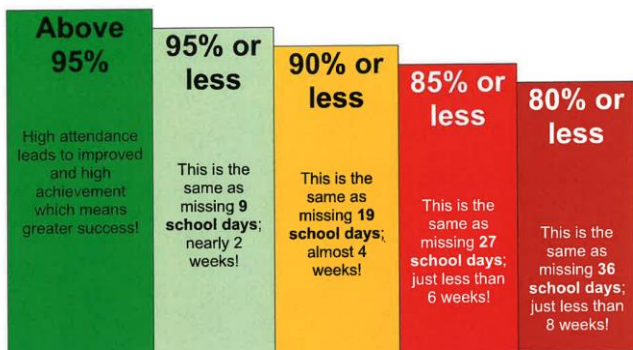


The right to freedom of association is relevant when children and young people act as human rights defenders.

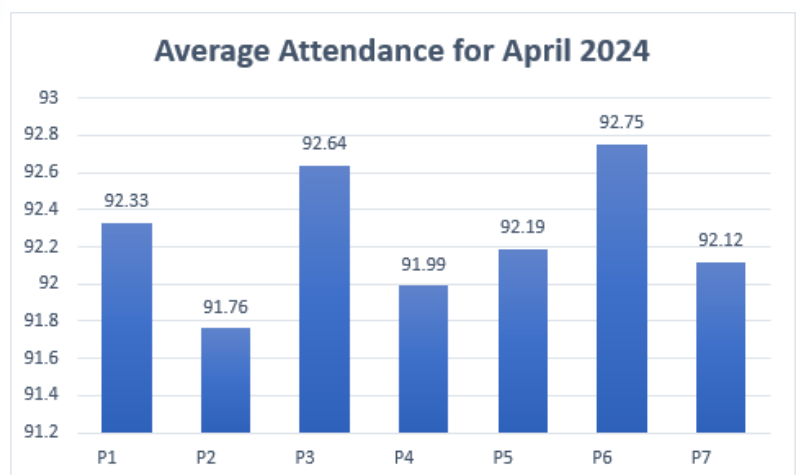
Improving Attendance at Noble Primary
