 UNCRC Article 32

I have the right not to have to work unless I am old enough and it is safe

Article 32 of the UNCRC says that children and young people shouldn't be able to work until they reach a certain age. In Scotland, they're not allowed to do almost any kind of work until they are 13. Rules about the work they can do remain in place until they are 18.

The number of hours a child or young person can work in a week should be limited by the government. When they work, they should be protected from violence.

We will let you know in advance, class arrangements for PE/Outdoor Learning. On these days children must arrive at school with:

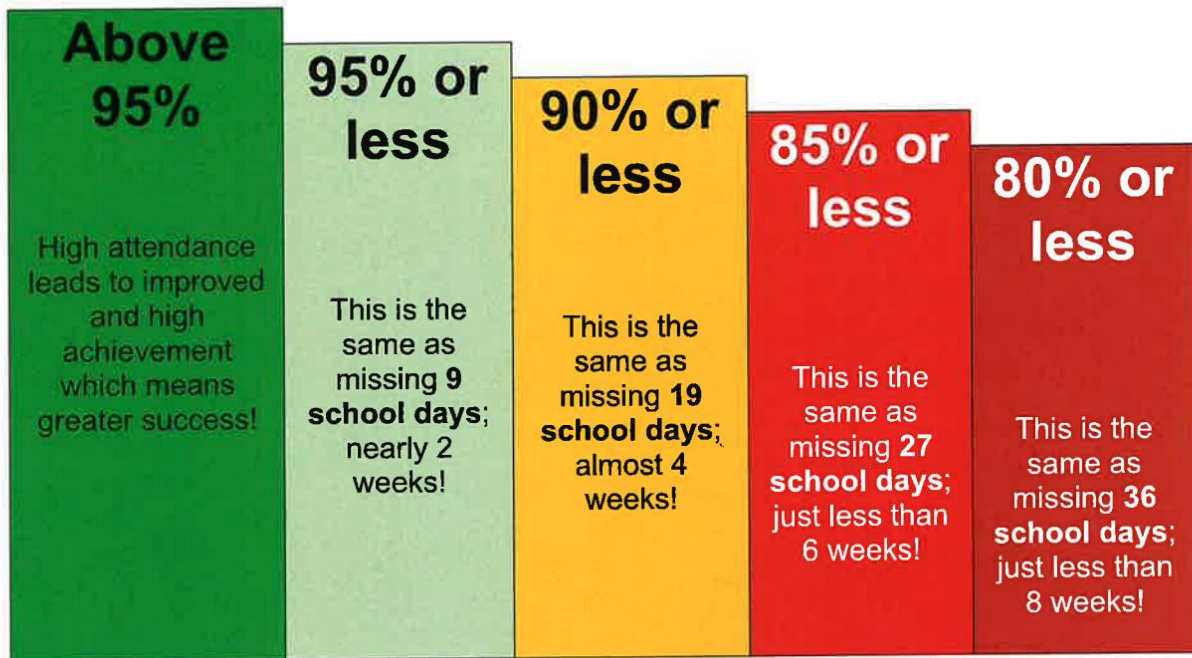
- Black jogging bottoms

Focus on Attendance

We monitor pupil attendance daily. Regular school attendance will ensure that your child does not miss out on any key learning and teaching opportunities.

The average attendance rate across North Lanarkshire is around 95%. Your child's summary of attendance will be issued at the end of term. Below is an infographic of how that translates over the session.



School Priorities for 2024/2025

Next session, our school improvement plan will focus on the following three priorities:
