Choose 4 activities to complete for each day you are off school. Colour in the square when you have completed each activity.

Write a letter to your P1 teacher and tell them all the things you enjoyed learning, and the best memories of your 7 years in primary school.	Write a persuasive piece of writing explaining which is the best football team, and why. If you don't like football, then why not choose a TV show or YouTube channel and write about that.	Write an informative job description of people who help us. You can choose from fire fighters, nurses, police officers, or doctors.	Complete the Joe Wicks Body Coach workout from YouTube. Challenge: Design your own 20 minute fitness circuit and lead it for your family.
Write a set of sequenced instructions of how to do the Macarena.	Design a picture on a piece of paper, making sure to colour in the whole page. Now cut the paper in to pieces to make it into a jigsaw puzzle.	Write out your times tables 2-12 and ask an adult to test you afterwards.	Write out the alphabet in CAPITAL LETTERS and go through each letter marking in the angle types. For example: E has four right angles in it.
RME: Research the story of the Good Samaritan and design a cartoon strip to represent the story.	Choose an animal from Scotland and research it. Write down 10 facts about the animal, making sure you put the information into your own words. Now draw the animal in its habitat.	Play maths games on the internet for 30 minutes. This can be using Sum Dog or Cool Maths Games. Look out for Sumdog challenges!	Keep a diary of your food and drink for three days. Split the meals/food into the sections of the food plate. Eg, fruit and veg, carbohydrate, dairy, protein and fats.
Choose one of the following titles and write your own story. - The adventures of Albert the Alpaca - Not all superheroes wear capes - Dogs don't bark, they miaow.	Using your spelling words, carry out the challenges set by Miss Miller on GLOW. These will include capital letter spelling, dotty spelling, pyramid spelling and more! Why not come up with your own type of spelling?	Write a fact file for someone from the past or present who has changed the world for the better. You can write about one of the people we learned about in class, Martin Luther King or JFK. Or maybe someone new like Marie Curie or Nelson Mandela.	Using a tablet or a phone, record yourself reading a story. Watch it back. Record it a second time and try adding in even more expression. Make a note of what you notice.
Write ten exciting sentences using an adjective in each sentence. Your sentences should include a connective to make it longer. Remember to underline the adjective in each word.	Use your times tables to create percentages of whole numbers. For example, 25% of 40 = 10. We know that because 25% and $\frac{1}{4}$ are the same.	Using online timetables, plan a journey from your front door to Inverness. What is the quickest way to get there and how much will it cost?	Play a game of Times Table Buzz with an adult. Practise using the 6, 7, 8 and 12 times tables.

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
