#### JANUARY 2025

- Introduction of special 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary 'Milestone Moment' stickers for use throughout 2025.
- **Friday 31<sup>st</sup> January** (*St John Bosco, patron saint of educators and youth*)  
Presentation of 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary medals to Cathedral pupils and staff after Mass (principal celebrant: Bishop Toal).

- **Dedication of Jubilee Door of Hope:** 6<sup>th</sup> January
- Reflect in class and at assemblies on **Jeremiah 29:11**  
*'I know the plans I have for you', declares the Lord, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you HOPE and a FUTURE'.*
- Introduce Examen prayer across all stages.



#### FEBRUARY 2025

- Whole-school mini topic on history of school and parish. Learning will be captured on showcase boards.
- Class visits to Motherwell Heritage Centre.

- **Meet Luce** (mascot for the 2025 Jubilee Year)
  - Raincoat: journey through life's storms
  - Staff and shell: signs of a pilgrim
  - Muddy boots: the long journey
- **Connecting with the elderly and sick in our local community**, including a programme of visits to nursing home.  
*'Signs of hope should also be shown to the sick, at home or in hospital. Their sufferings can be allayed by the closeness and affection of those who visit them. The elderly, who frequently feel lonely and abandoned, also deserve signs of hope.'* (Pope Francis)

#### MARCH 2025

- **Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> March** (*Feast of the Annunciation*)  
Dedication of 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary stained glass window in stairwell. This will include a reception for invited guests, including former clergy.

- **A hope and a future for the poor**, linked to Lenten almsgiving.  
*'I ask with all my heart that hope be granted to the billions of the poor, who often lack the essentials of life.'* (Pope Francis)
- **Mark in March:** an invitation to Primary 7 pupils and all Cathedral staff to read the entire Gospel of Mark.  
*'In our journey towards the Jubilee, let us return to Scripture and realise that it speaks to us...'* (Pope Francis)
