

Students, parents, teachers and others are asked to reflect on their own roles in the education process – at home, in school, in the local parish and in other educational settings.

# St Joseph's

From the moment a child joins our school family in primary 1, they are nurtured and nourished by all other members of our school community. They are gifted their Saint Joseph's tie by their primary 7 buddy who then supports them and cares for them throughout their first year at primary school. This journey as part of our faith family continues until they leave in primary 7 with the following message from Pope Francis

"Dear young people, do not bury your talents, the gifts that God has given you! Do not be afraid to dream of great things'

Our school is proud to be at the heart of our wonderful community.

Our children take pride in their community and their roll in the family of St Joseph's Parish. We enjoy wonderful relationships with both Father Kenny and Father Rooney who are an integral part of our school staff team.

As a community of faith, we attend Holy Mass at least once a month. Each month, a different class plan, prepare and deliver the scripture alongside Father Kenny and Father Rooney. In preparation for this, all children learn about the lives of relevant Saints and use these teachings in our daily lives. Father Kenny and Father Rooney will be joining us soon to bless our Advent Wreath, our Nativity Crib and our Advent Promises and Wishes Tree.

At this time of year we are preparing for our annual 'reverse advent calendar' where we collect different items each day in December to donate to the Bethlehem House of Bread Foodbank and baby products for Cumbernauld and Kilsyth Baby Bank. This year our Pupil Council will organize our collection, where they will encourage all other children to get involved.

We have a great affiliation with many charities, in particular with St Andrew's Hospice in Airdrie who we support through prayer and action, Missio Scotland who we work closely with throughout the school year and SCIAF who we support especially during Lent but throughout the year as necessary.

Each year we nominate 4 Missio Champions who lead us in prayer and create fun ways for us to support children all over the world. They recently held a wonderful Missio Assembly where we met some of the children who we support in Zambia.

Our senior pupils in primary 6 and 7 are busy developing their individual faith journey through focus on their Parish Faith Award where they look for ways to live like Jesus and to use their God given skills and talents to help others throughout our parish and wider community.

Our school vision of Love, Laughter and Learning was created by our Pupil Council and like everything we say, think and do is underpinned by our Gospel Values. As a whole school community we celebrate our smiles and talents as gifts from God and we look for ways to share these with others, remembering that something as simple as our smile can change someone's day. We discuss our privileged roll as disciples of God weekly at assembly and celebrate times when this has been evident in how we have treated others and how others have treated us.

We are very blessed to have children and families from other faiths in our school community and we love learning about this as part of our learning through This Is Our Faith.

It is a privilege to be part of the wider faith community of Our Lady's High School and we love welcoming back former pupils – especially those working on their Caritas Award. We welcome them back regularly and they are great roll models for our own children as they deliver a range of fun and interesting activities.

As a community of faith, we have regular opportunities for worship as well as our charity giving. Each year we have a number of children who participate in the Pope Francis Faith Award, sharing their God given talents to benefit others. This year's children were enrolled on the Feast of All Saints Day. Many of our children are involved in worship at both St Lucy's and Sacred Heart parishes by serving, being young leaders and cleaning of the Church! Our Laudato Si and Eco Work underpins our commitment to taking care of and being responsible for our common home. We were one of the first schools in Scotland to be designated a Missy Moo School by Missio Scotland because of our fundraising for the charity. We regularly support the Archdiocesan Pastoral Care Fund e.g. by donating the proceeds of our Christmas Concerts. We also have a monthly food bank collection, which directly supports families in our local area.

In doing so we attempt to be witnesses to our faith as asked by Pope Francis:-

As we plan for our school celebrations for this year's Catholic Education Week, we begin on our in-service day with a Staff Prayer Service followed by a Family Prayer Service on St Margaret's Feast day. 
#### St Margaret of Scotland
