

Introduction

This Kid's Life is a booklet that focuses on how a child lives daily life in a different country, compared to how people live in their own country. This particular book tracks the life of a girl named Maria Luisa who lives in the country of Nicaragua.


When beginning your study of this booklet, you can choose to give your students a pre-test that will check to see what understandings or misconceptions they have about what living in Nicaragua is like. Next, you can read a two-page letter from **Maria Luisa** to help your students learn about daily life for children in Nicaragua. 


What I Think Life in Nicaragua is Like....


1. What is the very first thing you think of when you think of the country of Nicaragua? Draw a picture of it.

A Letter from Maria Luisa

Hola! Me llamo Maria Luisa. That means 'My name is Maria Luisa.' I am 11 years old. I live in the capital city of Nicaragua with my parents and younger brother. My city is called Managua. I would like to share with you a little about my daily life in Nicaragua.

Life in Nicaragua is good! A lot has changed since when my parents were little children. Nicaragua is a much safer country now and I am happy to call it home.

I wake up each day at 5 a.m. by hearing the church bells ring. It's so nice to wake up to them. We wear uniforms to school. I wear a long blue skirt and white blouse, and my younger brother Marcus wears blue pants and a white button-down shirt.

My mother makes us breakfast every morning. We usually have rice, beans, tortillas, and freshly squeezed orange juice. Sometimes we eat on the patio and enjoy our family time together.

School starts early, at 7:00 a.m. I take many different subjects: English, Spanish, math, science, health, and physical education. My favorite class is physical education. We often play baseball, which is the national sport of Nicaragua. Soccer is another popular sport.

My least favorite class is life education. In this class we learn about good habits and how to treat each other well and be good people. I learn a lot of good information in this class, but we have a lot of homework, so I don't like it as much.

I go home with my brother at noon. We eat lunch inside because it is very hot outside during this time. Today my mother made us gallo pinto for lunch. We eat this a lot. It is fried rice with onion, sweet peppers, red beans, and garlic. I just love it!

Four days a week my brother and I go back to school for band practice. I play the flute and he plays the trumpet. There is a dance squad that dances while we play our instruments. Next year I will try out for the dance squad. I hope I make it! It looks like a lot of fun.

After band practice we go back home and I play with my brother for a while. After we play, we sit down together and do our homework. Tonight I'm writing this letter for English class. I'm excited to receive an English speaking pen-pal. Do you have any other pen-pals?

For dinner tonight we are eating chicken, salad, and tortillas. It's going to be yummy. You might think all of our food sounds similar, but my mom makes it with different spices and oils, so it does taste different.

After dinner our family will sit by the TV and watch a show or two together. During the commercials we will tell each other about what happened during our days.

I get ready for bed at around 8:30 p.m. I brush my teeth and take a shower, then I crawl into bed. I'm totally zonked out by then (did I use zonked out correctly? I just learned that word in English class today).

I had better go. I need to help my mom make dinner!




Facts and Discussion About Nicaragua


- The capital of Nicaragua is Managua.



Create a Nicaraguan Lizard


The rainforests and cloud forests of Nicaragua are filled with *fauna*, like orchids, and *flora*, like lizards, sloths, and monkeys. There are 178 known species of lizard in Nicaragua. Let's create our own jumping lizard.


Materials:

- lizard template
- crayons/markers/colored pencils
- scissors

Instructions:

Photocopy the following template on cardstock paper. Your students should color and cut out the lizard from the template. Next, students should fold the lizard in the middle. Then, they can push down on the tail to make the lizard jump.










Materials:

Print out the fish color page. Allow students to color the fish in vibrant colors - orange, yellow, blue, and other bold colors. You can look on the internet for inspiration.








A Postcard from Nicaragua








Nicaragua Crossword Puzzle





Think about things we have in common with people in Nicaragua, and things we have that are different. Then, pick three things you would like to learn about Nicaragua.






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
Here are some more **free activities** that your students may enjoy:
