New Life

Primary 2a and 2b will be taking on some additional responsibility this month. A Chick Egg Hatchery will be delivered to each class on 5th March. This project involves observing the process of going from egg to chick and looking after our chicks until they are collected and re-homed. This is a valuable and meaningful experience for our children and we look forward to meeting our chicks soon.

P4/5, P5 and P5/6 have been nurturing Brown Trout through the Clyde in the Classroom project for several weeks. They will release the fish into the River Clyde w/b 4th March.

Rights Respecting Schools' Day

We will host a Rights Respecting Schools' Day on the 26th April. We have been raising awareness and celebrating our rights for many years now and we encourage our children to know their rights and to learn about how adults can support them. Our Articles for March and April are:

Article 13 - Every child must be free to express their thoughts and opinions and to access all kinds of information, as long as it is within the law.

Article 14 - Every child has the right to think and believe what they choose and also to practise their religion, as long as they are not stopping other people from enjoying their rights. Governments must respect the rights and responsibilities of parents to guide their child as they grow up.

Article 15 - Every child has the right to meet with other children and to join groups and organisations, as long as this does not stop other people from enjoying their rights.
