
Parental Learning Reflection

When completing the parental learning reflection with your child, you could use information gained from the following places:

- 1. The completed work in their snapshot jotter.
- 2. The home learning guide that their teacher has provided.
- 3. The stickers in their homework diary.
- Learning that has been tweeted or blogged specific to your child's class.

It is our hope that by following the steps on the Reflection sheet, you will be able to have a meaningful and positive conversation with your child about their learning.



- 1.The 1st section is there so your child gets to 'show off' their new learning to you. You could use 1 particular piece of work from the jotter to stimulate this discussion.
- 2. Please use the next section to communicate with the teacher if you had specific questions for your child based on this initial discussion.
- 3. It is our hope that as the children become more familiar with this layout, they will be able to choose a variety of words to use in the 3rd section.
- 4. Please use the 4th section to share with your child which piece of work you liked best and why.
- 5. It is important that our pupils value the link between home and School, which is why we are asking you to support your child with some next steps in section 5.
- 6. Please use the 6th box to indicate that you are happy with the work in the jotter. If you have any questions, you can indicate to the teacher what your query is and how you would wish to be contacted using this section of the sheet.



Pupil Learning Reflection

The learning reflection should take your child on a journey through their learning within a specified period of time. The number of boxes and level of detail that children are asked to write, increases as the children progress through their journey at Orchard.

Your child will have been asked by their teacher to identify what they believe their learning successes were that month.

Where appropriate, they will also be asked to write a statement about anything they are still unsure of

The pupils will add words, phrases and drawings to describe how their learning experiences have been. This should be an honest reflection and will be individual to each pupil.



When developing a Growth
Mindset, children are encouraged
to use their mistakes to help
them move forward. They should
view difficulties faced during
learning as a challenge to be
overcome with hard work and
determination. As our pupils grow,
we are asking them to view their
mistakes as vital learning
experiences.

Your child's teacher will support
your child to complete this
learning reflection in a positive
and honest manner. Evaluation
from the teacher and
opportunities to correct mistakes
will support your child in knowing
where their learning is.
