<p><u>Comprehension</u> Write a list of questions you could ask someone about the book or ask someone to write down some questions for you to answer.</p> 	<p><u>Visualisation</u> Create a picture, diagram or mind map to describe the characters or setting of the book.</p> 	<p><u>Summary</u> Write or draw the most important events that have happened in the story.</p> 
<p><u>Predictions</u> Make predictions about what will happen in the next part of the book. Include what you would do if you were the main character in the story.</p>	<p><u>New Front Cover</u> Design a new front cover and blurb for the book you are reading. Include the title and author.</p>	<p><u>Book Review</u> Write a review of the book for a friend. Remember to include a little information about the story, your favourite part and a picture of the main character.</p>
