

Literacy Across Learning Harry Potter Theme





Write a newspaper article for 'The Daily Prophet' The Wizarding world rejoices as He Who Must Not Be Named is defeated.



New Vocabulary – Choose your favourite character from Harry Potter and think of interesting words to describe them. E.g. what do they look like? their personality, their actions etc.



Discuss emotions which are shown through the film/book. How do we know the characters are feeling this way?



In Harry Potter and the Chamber of Secrets, Ron Weasley's Dad secretly owns an enchanted muggle car that can fly! Imagine you could enchant an everyday object. Draw your design and write about the magical properties that you have given it.

Common words- choose a few of your common words and use them in Harry Potter theme sentences.



Design your own unique magical/mythical character and describe them. What do they look like? What powers do they have, any weaknesses etc.



Write and perform to your family your own magical spell. Let your family put you in the 'Hot Seat' and ask you questions about your spell.



Design your very own Magical Wand. What sort of special features does it have? You could draw it or make it with Lego or junk modelling or Playdoh.



Friendship is one of the main themes in the Harry Potter Books/films. What does it mean to be a good friend? Write a recipe for friendship and share it with your best friend.
