Miss R gave us a picture and we had to guess what it was.

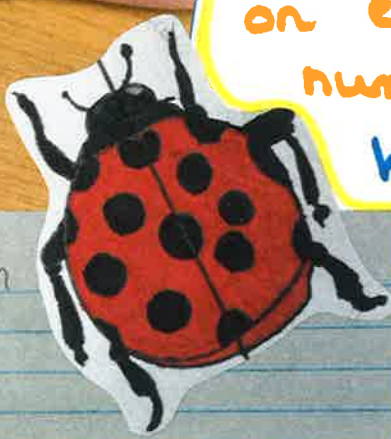
We completed comic strips and Fibonacci poems. Literacy and Maths combined!
