Head Teacher Update

Staffing Update

- Miss Barr, who takes P4 on a Thursday, is now also with us on a Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday, and is providing additional learning support across the school.

Establishment Fund Committee

 An Establishment Fund Committee has been created to oversee the use of the Establishment (School) Fund. The first meeting took place on 10th January where the constitution and office bearers were agreed. A copy has been provided to the Parent Council and staff for approval.

P7 Update

- Hoodies were given out at the start of this term. Thanks again to the PC for funding this again this year.
- Children have been at Strathclyde Park this week and feedback has been very positive so far.

Pupil Leadership Groups

Aim High Team

 Since the last Parent Council meeting the children have organised the Christmas Post.

- At our December and January meeting we focused on self-evaluation using Wee HGIOS and focused on Theme 5-Our successes and achievements. The children have given very positive feedback, they felt the school recognised wider achievement well and they were given lots of opportunities to lead within the school. The children chatted about the wide variety of clubs available to them and how they have enjoyed attending competitions. They would like to do something similar to skills academy but invite professionals from different organisations in and do different taster sessions, similar to a careers day.
- Our next event will be Children's mental health week and this will take place on Monday 26th February - Friday 1st of March and we are looking for parents to volunteer and deliver workshops similar to what Mr and Mrs Diston did. They had other ideas on how to raise awareness and promote positive mental health. We have changed mental health week due to P7 being at Strathclyde Park during the actual dates.

Fundraising Team

- In November, Children in Need raised £388.70.
- The Christmas Cards raised £370.
- The Fundraising Team kept our latest fundraiser really simple by having a dress down day with bring a food item if you wish (instead of the traditional £1 donation). Due to P7s being at Strathclyde Park for the planned week of the foodbank collection, the fundraising team opted for 2 food collection Fridays instead to avoid P7s missing out. We usually do the Foodbank collection over the course of a couple of weeks as it is one that our families are keen to support and it allows the time for donations to be collected and dropped into the school.
- Our next fundraising event will be for Cancer Research in March and we are hoping to plan an event which will welcome our families into the building.

Reading Schools

 P5 children have been running a reading club for the younger children. The P5s have also been creating YouTube videos about their favourite books and they are developing reading awards.

Sports Leaders

- Sports Leaders are running a lunchtime football club for P3 children starting later in February.
- Stephen from Active Schools is also coming to train the rest of the Sports Leaders this term.

Digital

Our Digital Leaders have continued to support classes with their digital learning.
They also supported the Rochsolloch Readers to create their YouTube videos. A few
of our classes are also about to begin a trial of using the app 'Book Creator' as a tool
for children to record aspects of their learning. This would hopefully be a good
alternative to SeeSaw which we are not able to use anymore due to GDPR issues.

Additional Support Needs

 One-to-one mental health support: we have been able to extend the support for P6 and P7 pupils, meaning more children are benefiting from intervention this term.

Football Strips

 New larger kits were successfully ordered with the financial support of Cairnhill Community Council. We had them badged at Scotcrest and our P6 and P7s wore them at a football festival late last year.
