Nursery Bags

This session we have invested in a nursery bag for each child, colour coded by their group and their name tag. In each bag, we would ask that you keep a full set of spare clothing, their nursery indoor shoes and sun hat, all which should be clearly labelled with your child's name. A Sharpe pen is available in the cloakroom. In the basket should be their outdoor shoes and any wellingtons that you wish to leave.

Can we ask that you do not take these bags home and check their contents on a regular basis?



Creating Independence



Within the nursery we hope that the children will develop their independence skills, which with your help can only be achieved if you consider their footwear and clothing which is worn daily.

Where possible avoid jeans with buttons as many toileting accidents can occur when they experience trying to undo tight buttons, leggings and jogging bottoms are much easier and girls are at less of a risk by having their dress or skirt caught when climbing.

Shoes both indoor and out are easiest to remove if they have Velcro fasteners, laces
