## Outdoor learning

Many people fear that learning outdoors in all weathers causes cold and flu like symptoms. Research has shown that this is not the case. When learning outdoors children are encouraged to dress appropriately with waterproof clothing, hats, scarves and gloves and we now have a supply of warm wellington socks which the children can borrow as our wellingtons do not keep feet warm like their own boots. For snack there is always a hot drink outdoors and children can return in at any time, however if you feel strongly that you do not wish your child to learn outdoors when it is cold, windy or rainy please ensure that you inform Isabel whose responsibility it is to ensure that all staff are kept informed daily





Each week we post some of the learning which you child has been involved in throughout the week along with a diary of events for the following week. Please remember to have a look and ask your child if they can share some of the learning which has taken place.

Sickness or illness



Viruses can spread easily amongst children, whether that be from a cough, sneeze or touch. We have been working closely with the children to remind them of the importance of good hand washing:

- After they blow or wipe their nose
- Before eating food
- After flushing the toilet

If your child has been suffering form any cold or flu like symptoms it is advisable that they remain at home until the symptoms have resolved. Any sickness or diahorrea symptoms, then children or their parents/carers should not re-enter the nursery until at least 48hrs after the last bout.
