Hi There,

We are still on site and progressing with the works.

This is the 3rd newsletter to keep you all updated on progress with the new Nursery Extension at your school - Shawhead Primary School. The timber kit panels have been installed and you can now see the shape and outline of the building with all the door and window openings. The structural steel is also now in place and there is a large steel ridge beam that will support the roof. Around the perimeter of the extension is a scaffold which will let the joiners progress with the roof and gives the other trades a platform to build brickwork, etc.
