Our topic this term is Seasons.

They are learning to create words and are making great progress with their sentences and story writing. Please encourage your child to practise their letters at home.

We are also learning to write the days of the week and months of the year.

Children are enjoying learning about 3D shapes. We will be moving on to investigating money which will further develop their awareness of how money is used in our daily life. Children will be learning to recognise coins and use a range of coins through a variety of activities.
