
If you are in the cloakroom and the doorbell rings please alert a member of staff. Please do not allow the children to open or close the gate.

The hinge on the gate allows it to move both ways which has resulted in head injuries in the past Staff have noticed that some children are being allowed to open the gate on a regular basis and we would ask parents to explain to their children the reasons why they should not touch it as it is for their safety.
