Parental Feedback

Many thanks to those of you who completed our questionnaire at our October Parent's Evening.

We had 52 responses in total. 81% of responses said that you preferred/enjoyed the online sign up system for Parent's evening. We are aware of some glitches and would like to remind everyone that it is very important that we have the correct contact information. This should be checked on your annual data return and the system relies on up to date e mail information. We have passed on concerns to North Lanarkshire Council around split parent appointments. 19 Parents said they would be interested in being involved in a short life working party however for many of you it would depend on the day/time. A letter will be issued next week with the details so please look out for it.

20 parents said they would be interested in Make, Move Munch club. I will be contacting the organisers and hope to run this at some point in the New Year.

Suggestions for improvements varied and we will look closely to see how we can take on board your feedback. Suggestions included;

- Homework include a space for parental communication.
- Access to Expressions App for separated parents (have passed this onto NLC)
- Parental Workshop on managing behaviour.
- Regular updates on teacher absence/changes.
- Provision of class cover which ensures consistent teaching.
- *Opportunities to try new foods.*
- Increased play supervision in yard
- More regular feedback on learning/behaviour

The comments in Italics are out with school control however I have passed them on to NLC and Catering.
