Change of Shoes

Can we ask all parents to bring a change of shoes for their child each day. This is really important as the Winter approaches as the children are now wearing wellies or Winter boots but these do not allow the children to play safely within the nursery. In addition we use the school gym hall on a regular basis and boots or wellies are not safe for the children to run about in. Trainers with Velcro are the best for indoor shoes as the children can become independent at changing their shoes when arriving and leaving nursery.

Infant school Yard

When crossing through the school yard we would ask parents/ carers not to stop and talk to other school children in the yard. The children in the school and nursery are being taught about stranger danger. Even if you know other children from outside the school we would ask parents not to stop and chat as it then makes it difficult for staff watching the yard to determine who is strangers and who is not.

Pirate Ship

Just a reminder to parents and carers that the pirate ship can become slippery when icy or wet we would ask parents to discourage their children from climbing on it out with nursery sessions before daily risk assessments have been carried out, to avoid any accidents happening on the pirate ship.
