Reading fairytales and rhymes will help Fairyland to recover. Ask a grown up about any traditional tales they enjoyed as a child. Was their favourite the Billy Goats' Gruff, The Gingerbread Man, Little Miss Muffet or something else?
We will be looking at some tongue twisting alliterations in class. Have a go at home and try to create your own. e.g. Peter piper picked a peck of pickled peppers. Build up listening skills by following 3-5 instructions independently without visual help. e.g. you're your face, brush your teeth, put on your pyjamas, choose a book.	Go outdoors.
