
#### Literacy

Our focus for <u>Writing</u> activities will be:


- **Discursive** writing discursive essays debating a particular topic of interest providing both arguments for and against, and personal opinions (linked to topic).
- Persuasive designing posters, advertisements and writing letters using persuasive language and powerful verbs (linked to school issues, Kilbowie and topic).
- Poetry imaginative poetry writing, using a range of poetry "tools" such as rhythm, imagery, similes, line breaks and onomatopoeia.

Our focus for <u>Reading</u> will be:

- Film Analysis: Narnia The Voyage of The Dawn Treader
- Poetry and Scots Poetry (Scots Lang)
- Reading comprehension tasks developing Close Reading
  and Grammar skills
- Reading books and information about Scottish Parliament







### **Focus for Learning**

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#### **Numeracy and Maths**

Our focus for this term is:

- Decimals Place Value and Rounding
- Decimals in context using the 4 number calculations
- Fractions, Decimals and Percentages
- Expressions and Equations

The children will be learning to:

- Identify decimal fractions with up to 3 decimal places.
- Read, write and order decimal fractions.
- Round numbers to 2 decimal places.
- Add, subtract, multiply and divide decimal fractions.
- Multiply and divide decimal fractions by 10, 100 and 1000.
- Investigate everyday contexts in which simple fractions, percentages or decimal fractions are used.
- Show the equivalent forms of simple fractions, decimal fractions and percentages.
- Investigate how sets of equivalent fractions can be created, understanding the meaning of simplest form.
- Compare and order the most commonly used fractions.
- Apply their knowledge of number facts to solve problems where an unknown value is represented by a symbol or a letter.





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# Topic

Our topics this term is: Scottish Parliament

The children will be learning to:



- Investigate a Scottish historical theme to discover how past events or actions have shaped Scottish society.
- Describe the main features of a democracy and discuss the rights and responsibilities of the citizens in Scotland.
- Investigate the features of an election and the work of representatives at a local level.
- Use evidence selectively to research current social, political or economic issues.

The children will take part in learning activities linked to:

- The History of the Scottish Parliament timeline
- The relationship between Holyrood and Westminster
- The law-making process in Scotland
- Devolved and Reserved matters and examples
- The role of a Member of the Scottish Parliament (MSP)
- The main political parties in the Scottish Parliament
- The process of an election
- Writing letters to local MSP
- Debate for or against new laws in class election
