Mathematics

- Use the online Sumdog maths programme.
- Measurement: Please discuss with your child the following words: length, height, width, metre, centimetre, weight, capacity. Can your child use these words in practical situations at home?

Maths Telling the Time: Please help your child to learn to tell the time on an analogue clock. Can they read the time to the nearest hour (e.g. 1 o'clock), half hour, quarter past and quarter to?
Extension: Reading the time to the nearest five minute intervals.
Please read and memorise the information on the maths information help sheet that has been sent home this month.

Health and Wellbeing

- Go for an autumn walk and collect autumn leaves.
- Review your health and wellbeing target from Term 1, do you need a new target?
- Do you know the correct steps for hand washing? Can you teach someone at home how to wash their hands correctly?

Creative Arts

- Make a homemade Halloween costume.

<p>Autumn Material Spelling Collect autumn leaves, twigs and stones. Use these items to 'write' and spell your words outside.</p>	<p>Halloween Paint It Pop some autumn and Halloween coloured paints in freezer bags and seal them. Then, use your finger to write your words in the paint without getting messy!</p>	<p>Chalk Talk Use chalk to write your spelling words outside. Draw a picture to match each word.</p>	<p>Halloween Hidden Spelling Draw and colour a Halloween picture. Hide your spelling words inside your Halloween picture.</p>
<p>Halloween Colour Spelling Write out your words and use Halloween colours for each letter or word.</p>	<p>Air Writing Write your spelling words in the air. Start by using tiny air writing and then get bigger and bigger with each new word.</p>	<p>Spelling Bee Work with a friend or family member. Take turns to read out one of your spelling words. The person listening must try to spell the word. E.g. cat → c-a-t</p>	<p>Song Time Sing your words to a well-known Halloween tune e.g. Halloween's Coming...!</p>
<p>Silly Sentences Write silly Halloween themed sentences using a spelling word in each sentence. Example: My dog wears a blue dress when taking a bath.</p>	<p>Story Time Write an autumn short story using as many of your spelling words as you can. Ask someone to record you reading your story aloud.</p>	<p>Type 'em Type your spelling words on the computer. Use a different colour for each word. E.g. cat dog</p>	<p>Backwards Words Write your spelling words forwards and then backwards. Example: Where erehW</p>

Clever Cookies

Practice the following phonemes: ou, ow

ou: count, house, outside, sound, mouse, etc.

Practice the following phonemes: sh, th, ch, ng

sh: ship, shop, etc.

th: three, think, etc.

th: that, these, etc.
