Primary 4 Term 1 Focus For Learning: Literacy

Shared Reading

This term, the class will participate in a modelling block in which we will investigate the six main reading strategies. Our focus text is *The Hodgeheg* by Dick King-Smith.

Guided Reading

After our whole class shared reading block, the children will participate in focused guided reading sessions with their class teacher each week. The children will focus on specific reading skills including decoding, comprehension, fluency, expression, questioning and prediction. The children will also complete follow-up tasks related to the skills learnt.

Spelling and Handwriting

The children will work on their personal, differentiated phoneme and common word spelling lists. In addition, the children will be encouraged and supported to use correct letter formation and pencil grip when handwriting.

Writing

This term, we will focus on the following writing genres:

- Recount (Retelling Events in Time Order)
- Information Reports (Using Facts)

Talking and Listening

The children will have frequent opportunities to participate in small group and whole class talking and listening experiences across all areas of the curriculum.



Primary 4 Term 1 Focus For Learning: Mathematics and Numeracy

Number and Number Processes

Children will investigate how whole numbers are constructed, develop an understanding of the importance of zero within the system and will be able to use their knowledge to explain the link between a digit, its place and its value. Children will also learn to use addition, subtraction, multiplication and division strategies when solving problems, making best use of the mental strategies and written skills they have developed.



Success of these learning targets will be indicated by the following:

- Children can read, write, order and recite whole numbers to 1000, starting from any number in the sequence.
- Children can demonstrate understanding of zero as a placeholder in whole numbers to 1000.
- Children can use correct mathematical vocabulary when discussing the four operations including subtract, add, sum of, total, multiply, product, divide and shared equally.
- Children can identify the value of each digit in a whole number with three digits
- Children can count forwards and backwards in 2s, 5s, 10s and 100s.
- Children can recite and recall the 2, 5 and 10 times tables by memory, in and out of order
- Children can demonstrate understanding of the commutative law, for example, $6 + 3 = 3 + 6$ or $2 \times 4 = 4 \times 2$.
- Children can solve addition and subtraction problems with three-digit whole numbers.
- Children can solve two step problems.

Primary 4 Term 1 Focus For Learning: Health and Wellbeing

Our focus for this term is: SAFE - Healthy Lifestyles

The children will learn:

- To understand the importance of being and feeling safe
- To assess safe and unsafe situations and behaviours and their effects on health and wellbeing

The children will also participate in Emotion Works, Relax Kids and Growth Mindset sessions to provide support for their mental and physical health and wellbeing.

Physical Education

This term the children will participate in a range of athletic activities.

There is no need for children to bring a change of clothing for PE this term. However, as the majority of PE lessons will take place outside, it is recommended that your child brings a weather appropriate jacket to school.

Reusable water bottles are also encouraged, as they are very practical and eco friendly.



Primary 4 Term 1 Focus For Learning: Interdisciplinary Learning (IDL)

This term our topics are as follows:

My Local Area: Cumbernauld

In this topic, the children will focus on the following learning outcomes:

- I can describe and recreate the characteristics of my local environment by exploring the features of the landscape.
- Having explored the landscape of my local area, I can describe the various ways in which land has been used.
- Through activities in my local area, I have developed my mental map and sense of place. I can create and use maps of the area.

Road Safety Scotland: Streetsense 2

In this topic, the children will focus on the following learning outcomes:

- By exploring the ways in which we use and need rules, I can consider the meaning of rights and responsibilities and discuss those relevant to me.
- I have participated in decision making and have considered the different options available in order to make decisions.

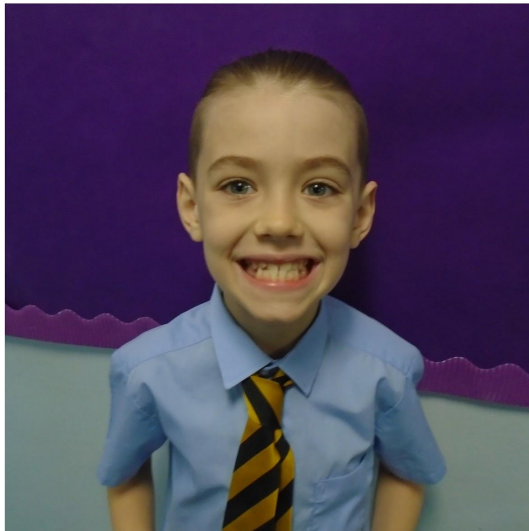
Primary 4 Homework Expectations
