<p>Encourage your child to use a strategy to decode words in their reading book:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Look at the picture ✓ Look at the sounds in a word, blend them together ✓ Is it a common word? 	<p>Log on to Sumdog (login on Work from Home Jotter) and play 15-30 minutes per week.</p> <p>Certificate now awarded on a weekly basis for pupil who plays Sumdog the most each week.</p>	<p>★ Talk about sharing with your child.</p> <p>Wanting and not immediately getting does not always mean someone is not sharing. Encourage patience or choosing different toys or activities.</p>	<p>Discuss where water is found in nature (e.g. oceans, seas, rivers) and in other states (e.g. ice, snow, hail, clouds) Explore the outdoors for examples of water changing state (e.g. rain from clouds, snow or ice melting, puddles freezing).</p>
