It is important however, that if your child has a negative result they should return to school.

Please ensure if your child is able to come to school that they do and that they attend on time. Literacy and Numeracy usually are taught early in the school day and it is difficult to catch up on missed learning.

Awards

We are moving closer to resuming normal school life and are delighted that we can hold small assemblies for our Curriculum for Excellence Awards. P1-3 will meet in the hall and celebrate the success of some of their classmates, followed by P4-7. It is always difficult to choose pupils as everyone is working so well and given all we have been through in the last couple of years we are extremely proud of all of them.

Class Masses

We are delighted that Father McKay is able to come in and hold class masses again in school. These will take place in P4/5, P5/6 and P7. Each class will have one Mass and one opportunity for Confession. We are planning and hoping for a whole school Mass on the 8th December, Feast of the Immaculate Conception and are very excited at the chance to celebrate and worship together as a school community.

Literacy

We have adopted a new phonics programme this year following a successful pilot in Primary 1 last year. I have visited all classes to see the children at work and have been very impressed at how engaged they all are in their tasks. We are hoping to have a workshop at some point later this session so that you can see exactly how it works and how it benefits children when learning to read, write and spell.

Numeracy

Our infant classes are being supported by a Numeracy coach from North Lanarkshire Council in integrating a SEAL approach to number development. SEAL stands for Stages of Early Arithmetical Learning. This involves using concrete materials and hands on resources to ensure children have a firm understanding of number which helps them with more complicated number concepts later in school.

COP26
