It means that your child will be the focus every 8 weeks. General observations will still take place daily. Please return as soon as possible as this can delay the observations.


Stay & Play

Learning in the nursery

Playroom one, the children are encouraged to help choose what they would like to have for snack and to prepare it. They are encouraged to be independent and do the dishes at the end. Some children made slime from a variety of ingredients including Chica seeds, this was left in the fridge overnight and the children discussed the changes that occurred. The measuring worms have been available to allow the children to categorise by colour, shape and size.

In playroom two, some of the children have been very interested in junk modelling and collaging. They also have had the opportunity to be consulted about what they would like out at the art area and water tray. Most children took part in painting tartan for Burns day using cars. In the water tray there was interest in frogs, fish, sponges, spoons and containers. Within the block play area the children were creating models. Outdoors some children were interested in the ice that had formed outside, they were problem solving how to break the ice and what they could use to do this. A few children were transporting the ice in trucks across the outdoor area. In the school hall the children have been enjoying playing a variety of ring games.

Independence

Within the nursery staff we are encouraging the children to be independent. We would kindly ask that you continue this at home and when you bring/collect your child/ren to nursery. This includes getting shoes on and off, so no laces please. Jackets on and off, dressing and undressing for the toilet. At times there is only one member of staff to ten children to get them ready to go outdoors, so the more you can encourage independence at home the more confident your child/ren will become.

Please treat the nursery/school staff with respect when engaging in any discussions about your child/ren.

Safety

Can we please ask that children do not come to nursery with beads, bracelets, beaded headbands, coins, small toys and jewellery. These are a choking hazard for some children.

Can we please ask all parents to remember to close the gate when entering or leaving the nursery. Please do not let your child open the gate at any time. When the children are outside with a member of staff when you come to collect your child, can we ask that you do not open the gate as we need to keep all the children safe that are outdoors. A member of staff will bring your child to you.

Procedures

In line with the care inspectorate polices and procedures, when a child is changed in the nursery their soiled clothes will be double bagged with a label and put into a sealed container in the cloakroom. If your child has been changed there will be a label on their peg asking you to see staff who will then give you their soiled clothing.
