










BOOK - JACK AND THE BEANSTALK





ROADMAP OF ALL BOOKS




GR CODE OF ALL BOOKS










THREE READ PROCESS

- STEP 1 Hear story as whole
- **STEP 2** Comprehension, thinking & conversations
- **TEP 3** Children retell the story



LEARNING INTENTION


We are learning to **develop** an understanding of story elements and structure.

SUCCESS CRITERIA

- **Listen** to the story
- **Recall** parts of the story
- Share my ideas, thoughts and feelings with others verbally







BLOOMS THINK ALOUDS


- **REMEMBERING** I wonder if you can remember the words that Jack hears the giant say every time Jack gets to the top of the beanstalk.
- **UNDERSTANDING** I think Jack's mother was annoyed with him at the beginning of the story because he sold their prized possession – the family's cow - for beans instead of money.
- APPLYING If I was Jack I'm not sure I would've trusted a stranger if they said the beans were magic. I wonder why Jack trusted the stranger.











BLOOMS THINK ALOUDS

- ANALYSING I wonder how Jack felt when he realised the giant had woken up and was chasing after him.
- **EVALUATING** I think Jack must be very brave to keep climbing the beanstalk and visiting the castle as he knows a giant lives there.
- **CREATING** I think we should plant our own bean seeds and watch them grow!








What did Jack take from the giant's castle? Why did he take these things?





How many beans did the stranger give Jack for the cow?








What did Jack's mother do with the beans when he got home?








What grew and grew through the night?

PLAY CHALLENGE QUESTION?




Do you think Jack should've climbed up the beanstalk? Why/Why not?

Work with others and retell a main event in the story using Stop Motion. Use puppets or cut out the characters to make your movie.






What would you do if a mysterious beanstalk appeared in your garden?








