

## THREE READ PROCESS

- STEP 1 Hear story as whole
- **STEP 2** Comprehension, thinking & conversations
  - STEP 3 Children retell the story

- **Recall** parts of the story

# **BLOOMS THINK ALOUDS**

- REMEMBERING I remember a time when I built something and someone came and knocked it down. I felt angry and upset.
- UNDERSTANDING I don't think straw and sticks are good materials for building a house. Bricks are stronger and can't be destroyed easily.
- APPLYING If I was going to build a house I would use something strong too like concrete or metal.









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# SUGGESTED DIGITAL ACTIVITIES


#### <u>LITERACY</u>




