

### Learning intention:

To use the syllabification spelling strategy.

### Success criteria:

- I can identify how many syllables are in a word.
- I can sort words by how many syllables they have.







# Syllibification

- Syllabification is a useful strategy to help spell words, it is also a technique used by poets to create rhythm in their poems. They select words which have a specific number of syllables to keep the beat of their poem.
- A syllable is a part of a word that contains sounds (phonemes), all syllables must contain a vowel sound.
- Think of it as a 'beat'. It helps to clap your hands as you say the word!

For example:

boy -1 syllable

shopp-ing -2 syllables

in-ter-net-3 syllables

### LITERACY - SPELLING




- ☐ Use some of the words from the previous task to write 2 sentences that have the same number of syllables (beats) in each sentence.

- ✓ Try clapping it out as you read it, can you count the syllables.
- ✓ Remember a syllable must contain a vowel sound.
- ✓ You can check using the syllable counter but have a go first.
