Pupils should carry the letter of authorisation that they will receive to prove eligibility for bus travel. Bus passes will be issued in the first week.





## Day 1 Preparation

Monday 16 August 2021

Pupils should arrive for 8.45am and enter by the front door.

They will be directed to the Assembly Hall

Guides will accompany your child to each class for the first week

Pupils arriving by car should be dropped off at the drop off zone.

At the end of the day pupils will exit the building by the back doors and will leave the campus at the school gates. Parents who are collecting their child should stand at the school gates and not at the front door.







### Pupils should carry

- a strong, sturdy bag
- stationery
- a water bottle
- a copy of their timetable (which will be issued on Day 1)
- Bus pass (if travelling by bus. This will be issued during the first week)





## The use of mobile phones

- Pupils are allowed to bring mobile phones to school but they must be switched off in class
- Pupils can use their mobile phone at interval and lunchtime to access games
- Mobile phones should never be used for taking photographs, videos or voice recordings





#### Morning Interval & Lunchtime

- Hot and cold, food and drinks are available from the canteen
- The cost of a hot meal, fruit and water is £3.15
- Money can be put onto Young Scot Card using reval machines or it can be transferred electronically using an ipay code (ipay codes will be issued in the first week of term)
- NLC website publishes menus on a weekly basis and lunches can be pre ordered
- Pupils can bring packed lunches and snacks
- S1 pupils must remain on the campus during interval and lunchtime
