









BGE Experiences and Outcomes

Additional Information

 Young people who choose to study PE will have a total of 5 periods of PE per week.



2 core periods + 3 periods 'elective' PE

 Young people must not select the same subject in two columns



Personalisation and Choice

- There may be a column which is difficult for some young people to make a choice.
- This can be discussed during the subject choice interview and it may, in some cases, be possible to adapt the choices to support individuals.
- In the event of oversubscription, a ballot is undertaken. This may have to result in young people being reinterviewed and not being guaranteed their first choice.



Travel and Tourism (N4/5)

- 4 units completed predominately using ICT:-Scotland, UK and Worldwide, Customer Service and Employability
- Travel and Tourism develops the skills, knowledge and attitudes needed for work in the travel and tourism industry.
- Pupils will enjoy a broad range of activities including role plays, research tasks, guest speakers, work-related scenarios and skills to deal effectively with customer enquiries in relation to travel and tourism in Scotland, the United Kingdom and the rest of the world.
- A good standard of written English is required for this course.



Health & Food Technology & Practical Cookery

There is a big difference between the two!!

HFT is more about the theory of food processes. More knowledge-based.

Any cooking done is all about demonstrating the impact of different ingredients/food processes upon a dish.

There is progression towards Higher in HFT.

Practical Cookery is more skills-based, practical in nature, and assesses the ability to prepare ingredients, demonstrate culinary skills and work in a safe environment. No progression beyond National 4/5.

Nat 5 Accounts

- The most challenging subject offered by the Business Department.
- Requires a high degree of problem solving and is suitable for pupils who are very good at maths and sciences.
- There is very little computer use in this subject and the class size is a max of 30.

- Nat 5 Accounts
- Nat 5 Units only
- Please Note there is no N4 award in Accounts

Nat 5 Business Management

- The second hardest subject offered by the Business Department.
- This subject requires pupils to a high degree of literacy as they will be writing notes from the Board and they have to provide detailed answers using specific command words in each question.
- There is very little computer use in this subject and the class size is a max of 30.

Potential Awards after S4:

- N5 Business Management
- N5 Units only
- Nat 4 Business Management

Nat 5 Administration & IT

- A very popular subject in the Business Department as pupils will be taught all the Microsoft Office packages, such as Word, Spreadsheets, PowerPoint and Databases.
- The majority of the course will involve pupils being on the computer and in classes of 20 pupils.
