1.Welcome

JF opened the Annual General Meeting by welcoming all in attendance. She then provided an outline of the evening's format:

- > Report on the work of Parent Council and its committee
- Report by Head Teacher (HT) on School Improvement Report 2016-2017 and School Improvement Plan 2017-2018
- Selection of new Parent Council members
- > Discussion of issues that members of Parent Council may wish to raise

JF handed over to AMcA (Chairperson).

2. Presentation on the work of the Parent Council

AMcA provided an outline on the work of the Parent Council.

Highlights included:

- ✓ The role of the Parent Council
- ✓ Fundraising achievements
- ✓ Purchases / projects as a result of fundraising achievements
- ✓ Treasurer's Summary See attached

AMcA raised concerns in relation to how many parents are actually aware of the activity of the Parent Council. In order to address this, it was agreed that AMcA would deliver a presentation to parents attending the Curriculum afternoon scheduled for Wednesday 20th September.

In addition to this, the fundraising achievements 2016 – 2017 would be detailed in the next school newsletter and a ballot box would be introduced in the school foyer to encourage parents to submit fundraising ideas.

3. Head Teachers Report 2016-2017

JF provided a copy of the detailed School Improvement Report 2016-2017.

Highlights of the report include:

- ✓ The impact on outcomes for learners
- ✓ Next steps for each priority
- 1. Increase pace of learning across Literacy, Mathematics & Numeracy and Health & Well-being.
- 2. Develop revised planning for progressive coverage and assessment of all music education using ABC music resource.
- 3. Improve attainment in maths for all learners.
- 4. Improve attainment in ICT.
- 5. Improve the physical health of children.

4. Head Teachers Strategic Overview 2017/2018

JF provided a copy of the School Improvement Plan 2017/2018 and outlined the rationale for the Plan including:

- ✓ Challenges facing the school
- ✓ The 'Keys to Success' designation
- The National Improvement Framework priorities & North Lanarkshire's 'Aspire' priorities
- ✓ Audit and evaluations of last years work, improvement plan, engagement with staff, parents/carer and learners
- ✓ National expectations in the Curriculum for Excellence and indictors from HGIOS

JF then presented a video that the pupils had filmed covering each of the Improvement Priority areas identified for 2017 – 2018:

- Improve parent partnerships through innovative whole school and targeted partnership work which will support the interventions for equality while targeting attendance, attainment, outdoor learning and social and emotional well-being.
- To improve attainment in numeracy and mathematics through further developing progressive learning pathways with clear process for assessment, moderation, monitoring and tracking.
- To improve attainment in literacy and English through developing progressive learning pathways with clear processes for assessment, moderation, monitoring and tracking.
- To improve opportunity for creativity and IDL work via the theme 'serving the common good' from SECS Developing the faith document in the school and refreshed relevant themes in the nursery

The children also outlined some of the detail behind the overall outcome for learners, the individual outcomes of projects, which staff members were responsible for the these projects and how the success of the projects would be measured.

The video of the pupils will be shown at the Curriculum afternoon scheduled for Wednesday 20th September.

JF also provided further information on the Pupil Equity Fund intervention and its intended impact.

£68,000 has been allocated from the Pupil Equity fund for 2017-2018.

The funding is to be used to target interventions and close the poverty related attainment gap.

Examples of the interventions include:

- ✓ Principal Teacher (Mrs Lambie) tasked with improving parent partnerships and attendance
- ✓ Additional teaching staff of 1.2 FTE (Vince Cairns and Claire McMichael)
- ✓ Purchase of support materials for literacy, maths and communication
- ✓ Speech and language therapy support
- ✓ Supports for challenging behaviour
- ✓ Flexible spending for outdoor learning visits for parents and children

Joint 60th Anniversary Celebrations with Golfhill Primary School

The Chairperson of Golfhill Primary Parent Council has again contacted AMcA to discuss marking the anniversary through a joint activity/event. AMcA asked members for ideas.

Ideas presented included:

Pupils to plant trees/bulbs Benches to commemorate anniversary Time capsule to be buried by pupils from each school

AMcA has agreed to go back to the Golfhill Chairperson with these ideas. When the joint venture is decided the Parent Council will organise the activity.
