

St. Andrew's Nursery Learning Overview



August-October 2016

Maths
MathsWe will explore number throughout the nursery and outdoor environment.We will learn the colour name of our groups and colours in the world around us.We will learn to use one to one correspondence in matching and sorting objects.We will learn mathematical language – same as, different, matching, similar.We will learn to collect information by sorting and we will make simple graphs to display our information. We will learn number songs and rhymes. We learn about shopping and experience handling money.Our TopicOur focus for learning is 'Settling in /back to nursery' 'Myself' 'My nursery' 'My community' and the weather.
Social Subjects
We will learn about the wider school and we will be able to identify the main areas of the school. We will visit the school playgrounds and use our safety rules to risk assess and keep ourselves safe. We will learn the name of our school, the address and its location. We will visit a local shop and experience buying and paying for snacks for the nursery. We will be visited by Karen the oral hygienist who will give us our own special toothbrush and teach us how to brush our teeth.
Music
 We will engage in the ABC music programme to further develop our awareness of sound, movement and rhymn. We will learn the song 'Let's move our heads' as part of the ABC music programme. We will learn a range of action songs and nursery rhymes to develop our awareness of literacy and numeracy and health and wellbeing. We will be introduced to the Spanish Tu y yo language programme and we will learn the song Hola, Hola, Buenos Dias.
Art
We will investigate and explore malleable materials indoors and outdoors.We will learn to use creative resources to produce paintings and collage.We will look at the works of some famous artists.
