<p><b>Literacy</b></p> <p>The children will learn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>To say, make, blend, read and write CVC words using magnetic letters.</li> <li>To learn to read and write tricky word spellings.</li> <li>To write 1 or more sentences, using appropriate finger spaces, capital letters and full stops.</li> <li>To use their letter knowledge to help them read simple stories.</li> <li>To continue to write their own personal &amp; imaginative stories</li> <li>To write fact files &amp; posters about 'The People Who Help Us'.</li> <li>To listen to the main points of a story and discuss the main events, characters and endings within it.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Maths</b></p> <p>The children will learn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>To recognise, write and count on and back consecutively within a decade (numbers to 30)</li> <li>To recall simple number bonds to 10 from memory</li> <li>To begin to find the answer to an addition or subtraction sum by holding the starting number in their heads and counting on or back</li> <li>How many are left when removing objects from a set</li> <li>Recognise and use the symbols + -</li> <li>To recite doubles to 10</li> <li>How money is used and to recognise and use a range of coins</li> <li>Match objects and sort using bar charts</li> </ul>
<p><b>Health &amp; Well Being</b></p> <p>The children will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Learn about 'healthy life styles' and describe in simple terms, what it means to be 'active'.</li> <li>Learn the benefits of trying and sharing new food experiences and compare foods from their own and other cultures.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Physical Education</b></p> <p>The children will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Continue to improve their concentration and social skills by active participation through 'The Better Movers and Thinkers programme'. Term 3 will focus on gymnastic skills.</li> <li>Follow rules when playing a variety of games.</li> </ul>
<p><b>R.E</b></p> <p>The children will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Continue to listen and share responses to New Testament parable stories read to them by Father Kris during 'Bible time'.</li> <li>Learn about the importance of Easter.</li> <li>Learn by heart Our Father, Glory Be, Hail Mary prayers.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Technology</b></p> <p>The children will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Continue to use technology to support their learning in all curricular areas.</li> <li>Use computers and I-pads and develop core word processing skills delivered by Miss Divers.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Inter-Disciplinary Learning</b> Music/Drama/Art/Social Studies/Science</p>	
<p>Through the topic of 'The People Who Help Us', the children will learn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>How different people help us in everyday life e.g Police, Firefighters, Teachers, Doctors and many more.</li> <li>Differences in emergency transport and medical equipment.</li> <li>Florence Nightingale and how she helped people years ago.</li> <li>To re-enact the roles of the people who help us using the 'Little Street' imaginative role-play areas.</li> <li>To express their own ideas through using a variety of drawings, paintings, collages and crafts.</li> <li>To be expressive in signing a variety of 'People Who Help Us' songs.</li> </ul>
