Next year we will look at ways to encourage more returns so that we can get a better picture of all our parents' opinions. After School Clubs



Our excellent after school club programme will begin again, week beginning 29th April running for 6 weeks until week ending Friday 7th June.

We will be sending a copy of clubs and asking parents to choose suitable clubs with their child and return information on which club they would like their child to attend. As well as this the children will be asked in class (Tuesday 23rd April). Numbers are restricted for clubs, therefore, to make it as fair as possible, consideration will be given to children who have not attended clubs previously. Where activities are over prescribed, names will be balloted and a waiting list created.

Good attendance is encouraged and registers are taken. Please alert the school if for any reason your child is unable to be present at the club.

Children who have gained a space on an after school club will have come home with a letter. This should be returned to school by **Wednesday the 24th April**. If your child is unable to attend please let Mrs Wood in the school office know as soon as possible so the place can be reallocated.
