### [Open Evening/ Meet the Teacher Night](#)

Please note that our annual Meet the Teacher Evening that traditionally takes place in September will not take place due to the ongoing pandemic and issues with crowds. ### [Breakfast Club](#)

All North Lanarkshire Primary schools host Breakfast Clubs. Our doors open 8.15am – 8.45am. Cost is £1. Breakfast club is free for Pr. 1 – 3. It is free to pupils in receipt of free school meals. Please note parents are not allowed into the school for drop off purposes at the breakfast club. There is no need to pre-register.

### [Uniform](#)

Could I please ask that you ensure your child remains in school uniform everyday and that the school tie is worn daily. We await delivery from the supplier of Pr.7 ties ordered before lockdown. Please note our uniform is grey (not black) trousers/skirt, grey jumper/cardigan, white shirt and black shoes or plain black trainers.

## School Yard – Social Distancing at the Perimeter of the School

Please note that parents are not permitted to enter the school yard either before 9.00am or after 3.00pm. In order to ensure **social distancing** for the health and safety of both pupils and parents please ensure you have informed your child/children of their pick up point well beyond the school gates if possible. Please note the infant gates are **only** to be used by pupils from Rm 1 – 4 and their parents. There is too much congestion at 3.00pm if this exit gate is used by other parents and pupils. Your co-operation would be greatly appreciated. Please try to **drop off and leave** as parents standing at the fence can be upsetting for some pupils. Social distancing/wearing a mask needs to take place among parents at the school fence.

## School Building News

Last session the school underwent a refurbishment that involved a full re-wire and the installation of a new heating system. The school was also painted. The painting of all corridors, classrooms, main foyer and assembly hall has greatly improved the appearance of the school estate. Work still continues to complete certain areas of the school.

## Nursery News

Contractors have been on site throughout the summer working to adapt a section of the ground floor at the infant department to accommodate our nursery class. They are also developing a section of school grounds to accommodate a separate entrance for the nursery class. We anticipate a completion of all works by mid October. Currently our new nursery class will be housed in the Time Capsule until all works have been completed.

It is anticipated that the nursery will be completed and ready to move in prior to the October break. It will greatly enable effective transition work from nursery to Pr.1. We can't wait to have our new nursery premises.
