STAFF ANNOUNCEMENTS

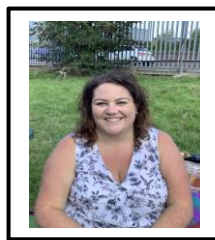
A huge congratulations to Mrs Collinson who has given birth to a baby boy. We send our warmest wishes to her family and look forward to her return to The Butterflies next year.

SNACKS/LUNCH

Jump in a pile of leaves

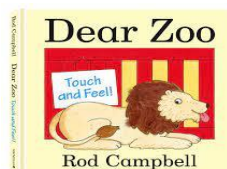

COVID GUIDELINES

We thank you for your continued support in following COVID 19 guidelines which are as follows: -

- Face coverings must be worn by adults at drop off and collection times.
- Please ensure you maintain a two- metre distance from adults at all times.
- Parents are prohibited in entering nursery playroom out-with enrolment day.
- Please be aware of COVID 19 symptoms and book a PCR test if your child or anyone in your household is presenting symptoms (High temperature, Continuous Cough, Loss of taste or smell).
- Please remember that all household members require a PCR test on the event that one person has COVID 19 symptoms. Household Isolation is required while waiting on results, your child can return to nursery following a negative PCR if feeling well.
- If your child is presenting with COVID 19 symptom please do not attend nursery and notify the nursery via phone call. If your child becomes unwell presenting COVID-19 symptoms while at nursery, you will be contacted to collect them. Your child can return to nursery if well enough following a negative test result or within ten days of receiving a positive test result.

We appreciate your understanding in these challenging times.

NURSERY BAGS

Could we remind parents and carers that children have their own nursery bags on their peg therefore are not required to bring a bag to nursery. If your child needs another spare change of clothes staff will inform you at collection times.
