Thank You

Many thanks for your wonderful support throughout last term. We greatly appreciate all that you have done to keep us informed about absences, particularly due to Covid, and for working with us to mitigate risk as much as possible. The last few years have been extremely challenging for everyone and we appreciate all that you have done to enable the school to provide as normal an experience for all children. Your understanding when we have had to make changes to class cover has been most appreciated at this time.

COVID - Updated Guidance

From Sunday 1 May, public health advice changed to a 'stay at home' message and replaced self-isolation for people who have symptoms or have tested positive for Covid-19. As a result, people who have symptoms of Covid-19 and who have a fever or are too unwell to carry out normal activities will be asked to stay at home while they are unwell or have a fever. They will no longer be advised to take a PCR test. What this means in practice is that children and young people (those aged 18 and under) with mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat, or slight cough - but who are otherwise well - do not need to stay at home and can

continue to attend education settings. They should only stay at home if they are unwell and have a high temperature. They can go back to school and resume normal activities when they no longer have a fever and they feel well enough to attend.

Drop off and Pick Up

All parents are once again kindly reminded to refrain from entering the school yard both before 9.00 am and before 3.00 pm. This is a Health & Safety issue that we ask you to comply with for the safety of all children. If picking your child up please locate yourself on the pavement around the school. **Please note the main entrance to the school is not a drop off point or pick up point for pupils to enter or leave the school on or before 9am or at 3pm. Please drop off your child in time for morning prayers at 9am.**

SAFE PARKING



Please note the zig zags lines around our school are not drop off points. **Please park and stride.** Parking is available in the Time Capsule car park and also in the car park of St. Augustine's Church. Please use these parking facilities.

Please note Traffic Regulation Orders will be enforced meaning that markings will no longer be advisory and drivers can be fined. This will mean the council can carry out enforcement duties in a similar way to enforcement of double yellow lines.

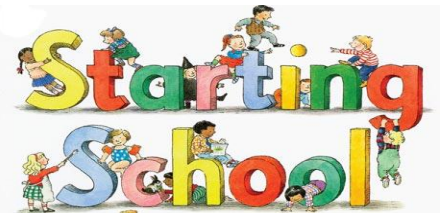
Wear Yellow Walk Day Pr 7
