## Your child's attendance

Studies show that good attendance in nursery can set a good pattern for attending school later. Interacting with adults and peers in the nursery setting greatly supports children's social and communication skills. Please always contact the nursery if your child is absent for any reason.

## **Child illness**

Please can we ask that your child does not attend nursery if they have a raised temperature, a severe cough or lots of sneezing. Children can come to nursery with a mild cold, as long as they are well enough to play. If you child has diarrhoea or vomiting, please keep them away from the nursery until they have been clear for 48 hours. Please always contact the nursery if your child is absent for any reason, particularly if they are unwell, as we may need to let other parents know should precautionary measures be required. Please keep your child at home if they have a temperature.



# **Spare Clothes/Personal Belongings**

We would like to remind parents/carers to please bring a spare change of clothes for your child's bag in case your child requires change for any reason. Please ensure your child has appropriate clothing for the weather such as wellingtons.

We also ask that you label all your child's clothing, shoes etc. to ensure they can be identified if misplaced.



## **Nursery Fund Donation**

This is a reminder that our Nursery fund is 50p per day or £2.50 per week. This money can be paid weekly, monthly or termly. It should be deposited into the bank in the foyer.

This money is used for snacks, baking materials, resources, Christmas, graduation and other things that we do not get funding for. Without your continued support we would be unable to undertake these activities.

#### **KEY WORKERS**

Your child is allocated a named Key Worker who will support your child each day. Staff aim to form relationships with all children and families and we encourage children to work with all adults in our nursery.

#### SNACK/LUNCH

Children will enjoy lunch and a healthy snack each day. Lunch menu will follow the NLC Nursery menu. We encourage children to try new foods. Please let your key worker know of any dietary requirements and fill in the appropriate paperwork where applicable. Please see NLC website for nursery menu.

#### **OUTDOOR LEARNING**

Outdoor play is a key aspect of daily play that presents a wide variety of learning experiences for all children. We take part in the daily mile each morning to prepare children for their busy day of learning. Children also have the opportunity to access the nursery garden each day both in the morning and afternoon.

Appropriate outdoor clothes/rainwear means our inclement weather does not stop us getting outside to play, investigate and have fun. Please ensure your child brings in a pair of wellies for outdoor play. Thank you.

#### **UNIFORM**

Children are welcome to wear their own clothes. However, we have our own nursery uniform that is available from Scotcrest.

#### **ROUTINES**

St Augustine's Nursery Class is committed to ensuring that children attending our nursery provision have time to settle into their new environment. Our initial priority is your child's emotional wellbeing and staff will be spending lots of time getting to know your child to ensure they feel safe and secure in their new setting. We will provide lots of learning experiences and will encourage free play to let your child settle in and become more confident in their learning environment. In time, our staff will be carrying out observations of all the children to help us plan a range of learning experiences to meet their individual needs and interests.

# PARKING AROUND THE SCHOOL AND NURSERY

Please be mindful of the zig zag markings around the school and nursery campus that prohibit parking. The zig zags are enforceable and would result in a fine.
