Drop off and Pick Up

Please note the main entrance to the school is not a drop off point or pick up point for pupils to enter or leave the school before 9am or at 3pm. Children are required to be in their line for morning prayers at 9am.

SAFE PARKING



The parking situation around our school is much improved, however, it remains concerning that some drivers park their vehicles near the roundabout or near the entrance to the Time Capsule as this can obstruct emergency services should they be called. Please note the zig zags are not drop off points.

Please park and stride. Parking is available in the Time Capsule car park and also in the car park of St. Augustine's Church. Please use these parking facilities.

Please note Community Police and Traffic Wardens will be making unannounced visits to our school campus as the zig zags around the school are now enforceable and fines can be given for unlawful parking. Our school JRSO Officers will be out and about and will issue our own St. Augustine's Parking Ticket. You really don't want one of them!

Please note there are plans to impose 20mph speed limits around the school in due course.

Parents/Carers of 3 to 5 years olds who are now eligible to apply for early learning and childcare 2024/2025 can apply at present. All 3 to 5 year old children are eligible to receive 1140 hours of early learning and childcare per year. The closing date for applications is Frid. 16th February.

Promoting Positive Behaviour
