## A warm welcome to our new starts

We are delighted to have welcomed 37 new pupils to our Pr. 1 classes. It is wonderful to see how quickly they have settled into their new environment, learning new routines and becoming acquainted with lots of new faces. We hope the initial enthusiasm continues and the children thrive in their new learning environment. A warm welcome is also extended to the new families who have joined our school community. ## Breakfast Club

All North Lanarkshire Primary schools host Breakfast Clubs. Our doors open 8.15am – 8.45am. Cost is £1. Breakfast club is free for Pr 1 -5 . Please note parents are not allowed into the school for drop off purposes nor is the breakfast club to be used as an early drop off for school. **Staff are on hand to supervise children who are at school for breakfast only not for early morning care/supervision.** Your understanding in this regard is greatly appreciated.

## Uniform

Your children look wonderful in their new school uniforms and are wearing them with great pride. They are a credit to you. Children are expected to wear their uniform every day and to change for PE lessons. Please note our uniform is grey (not black) trousers/skirt, grey jumper/cardigan, white shirt and **black shoes or plain black trainers**. Highly coloured footwear/trainers are not part of the school uniform. Please aim to ensure your child is dressed in the colours of the school every day.

## School Yard – Drop off and Pick Up

Please note that parents are **not** permitted to enter the school yard either before 9.00am or after 3.00pm. Please ensure you have informed your child/children of their **pick up point well beyond the school gates**. Please note the infant gates are **only** to be used by pupils from Rm 1 - 4 and their parents. There is too much congestion at 3.00pm if this exit gate is used by other parents and pupils. **Please do not gather or stand at the exit gates as this causes a high degree of congestion and makes it difficult for younger children to pass through.** Your co-operation would be greatly appreciated. Please try to **drop off and leave** as parents standing at the fence can be upsetting for some pupils. Pr. 1 pupils have a soft start and enter the school building on arrival at school and are not required to line up for morning prayers.

**Please note the main entrance to the school is not a drop off point or pick up point for pupils to enter or leave the school on or before 9am or at 3pm. Please drop off your child in time for morning prayers at 9am**

## SAFE PARKING



Please remember to **Park and Stride**. Parking is available in the car park of St. Augustine's Church and the Time Capsule. **Please DO NOT park on the zig zag lines around the school. It is inconsiderate and endangers lives.**

Please note Traffic Regulation Orders - markings will no longer be advisory and drivers can be fined. This will mean the council can carry out enforcement duties in a similar way to enforcement of double yellow lines. Police will make unannounced visits at drop off and pick times throughout the school year.

Please ensure your child brings gym shoes/trainers to change for P.E. sessions along with P.E. kit. **Outdoor shoes are not appropriate gym wear.** Thank you. Children will only be exempt from a P.E. session if a letter is sent to school stating the need for an exemption on medical grounds for a limited period of time. PE is part of the curriculum and **all** pupils are expected to participate.

## Communication

## Labelling Clothes and Lunch Boxes

This will ensure teachers can return belongings quickly to the rightful owner when clothes fall off pegs, blazers and jackets get mixed up or items are left behind.
