
After Mass pupils and parents had a chance to visit several departments around the school. They also had a chance to meet and chat with our S6 Subject Ambassadors.

St Andrew's Primary are fully committed to the spiritual formation of the school

community.

Our Mission Statement - <u>A Catholic family</u> aspiring to be kind and respectful to all, with learning at the heart of everything we do.

We began this year by welcoming the new Primary 1 children and their parents to the welcome Mass in August. During this Mass, which was celebrated by Father Sullivan, the Primary 7 children gifted their Primary 1 Buddy with a beautiful Prayer Card to take home.

We next celebrated Mass on the Feast of All Saints where Father Campbell enrolled our Primary 6 children in the Pope Francis Faith Award.

As we begin Catholic Education Week, we are having a 'Big Breakfast' in each of the classrooms and as we eat together, we give thanks to God for the food on our plates.

We are blessed to have two Parish Priests who regularly visit the school and

classrooms. The partnership between the school and both Parishes of Holy Cross and Sacred Heart has been strengthened this year through the formation of 'The Mini

Vinnies'. The Group have met with SSVP members of Sacred Heart Parish and have participated in Mass at Carrickstone Care Home. The children really brightened up some elderly folk's day when chatting to them after Mass!

The Mini Vinnies also led the rosary every Wednesday in October as well as leading children at assembly joining in the 1 million children!

They have also made Mini Vinnie Charity boxes which are on each altar in each

classroom. The aim is to raise money to give to both SSVP groups in both Parishes who can then give to those in our community who need our help. They are due to meet members of SSVP from Holy Cross this month to hear about the good work

being done there too and to help in any way they can.

At the end of Catholic Education Week, we will celebrate St Andrew's Day with Holy Mass. The whole school will be participating in the Mass as we honour our school's Patron Saint.

Let us remember the words of Our Lord Jesus Christ: "When two or three are

gathered together in my name, there I am in the midst of them."

This year the children, staff, parents and the wider community of St. Barbara's have been greatly supported by our parish and in particular by Fr. Campbell. We have thoroughly enjoyed coming to the church to celebrate Mass as a whole school community once again.

Our spiritual focus this year is centred on the theme of 'Honouring Jesus Christ as the Way, the Truth and the Life.' Reviewing our vision and aims for the school, we will reflect on how we are created in the image and likeness of God, how each of us is unique and on the ways in which we can promote an understanding of the Gospel and practise it in our lives.

During Catholic Education fortnight we will focus on the theme of the Synod: Communion, Participation and Mission. We will reflect, as Pope Francis has asked us to do on:

How well we come together as the children of God on our shared journey towards Him

How well we work to serve one another and participate in our faith communities

How well we fulfil our commitment to spread God's Word as active

participants as opposed to being passive bystanders in this mission

To launch Catholic Education Fortnight, the whole school will attend Mass on the Feast of St. Margaret of Scotland (16th November) when we will enroll our Primary 6 children in the Pope Francis Faith Award programme. The programme is designed to help children to show "signs of love" in their daily lives towards others and to be active members of their local Church. As Pope Francis said:

<u>St Joseph's</u>

From the moment a child joins our school family in primary 1, they are nurtured and nourished by all other members of our school community. They are gifted their Saint Joseph's tie by their primary 7 buddy who then supports them and cares for them throughout their first year at primary school. This journey as part of our faith family continues until they leave in primary 7 with the following message from Pope Francis

"Dear young people, do not bury your talents, the gifts that God has given you! Do not be afraid to dream of great things'

Our school is proud to be at the heart of our wonderful community.

Our children take pride in their community and their roll in the family of St Joseph's Parish. We enjoy wonderful relationships with both Father Kenny and Father Rooney who are an integral part of our school staff team.

As a community of faith, we attend Holy Mass at least once a month. Each month, a different class plan, prepare and deliver the scripture alongside Father Kenny and Father Rooney. In preparation for this, all children learn about the lives of relevant Saints and use these teachings in our daily lives. Father Kenny and Father Rooney will be joining us soon to bless our Advent Wreath, our Nativity Crib and our Advent Promises and Wishes Tree.

At this time of year we are preparing for our annual 'reverse advent calendar' where we collect different items each day in December to donate to the Bethlehem House of Bread Foodbank and baby products for Cumbernauld and Kilsyth Baby Bank. This year primary 1, 2 and 7 children have volunteered to organize our collection, where they will encourage all other children to get involved.

We have a great affiliation with many charities, in particular with St Andrew's Hospice in Airdrie who we support through prayer and action, Missio Scotland who we work closely with throughout the school year and SCIAF who we support especially during Lent but throughout the year as necessary.

Each year we nominate 4 Missio Champions who lead us in prayer and create fun ways for us to support children all over the world. They recently held a wonderful Missio Assembly where we met some of the children who we support in Zambia.

Our senior pupils in primary 6 and 7 are busy developing their individual faith journey through focus on their Pope Francis Faith Award where they look for ways to live like Jesus and to use their God given skills and talents to help others throughout our parish and wider community.

Our school vision of Love, Laughter and Learning was created by our Pupil Council and like everything we say, think and do is underpinned by our Gospel Values. As a whole school community we celebrate our smiles and talents as gifts from God and we look for ways to share these with others, remembering that something as simple as our smile can change someone's day. We discuss our privileged roll as disciples of God weekly at assembly and celebrate times when this has been evident in how we have treated others and how others have treated us.

We are very blessed to have children and families from other faiths in our school community and we love learning about this as part of our learning through This Is Our Faith.

It is a privilege to be part of the wider faith community of Our Lady's High School and we love welcoming back former pupils – especially those working on their Caritas Award. We welcome them back regularly and they are great roll models for our own children as they deliver a range of fun and interesting activities.

Every class will celebrate Catholic Education Week during the week beginning 21st November where we will reflect on everything we do to ensure that our Catholic School Community continues to play our part in our parish and wider community.

As a community of faith, we have regular opportunities for worship as well as our charity giving. Each year we have a number of children who participate in the Pope Francis Faith Award, sharing their God given talents to benefit others. Many of our children are involved in worship at both St Lucy's and Sacred Heart parishes by serving, being young leaders and cleaning of the Church! Laudato Si, part of our Eco work, underpins our commitment to taking care of and being responsible for our common home. We are 1 of only 15 schools in Scotland who have been designated a Missy Moo School by Missio Scotland because of our fundraising for the charity. We regularly support the Archdiocesan Pastoral Care Fund e.g. by donating the proceeds of our Christmas Concerts. We have a monthly food bank collection, which directly supports families in our local area.

In doing so we attempt to be witnesses to our faith as asked by Pope Francis:-

"All the Baptised are called to take part in the Church's life and mission." ~ Pope Francis

As we plan for our school celebrations for this year's Catholic Education Week, we begin on our in-service day with a Staff Prayer Service followed by a Family Prayer Service on St Margaret's Feast day. Class teachers will use the resources provided by the Catholic Education Service as well as exploring the lives of St Andrew and St Margaret. As a school community, we will come together in an assembly to share our learning and celebrate the occasion.





Masses are supported by Father McKay, and many children participate in preparing for and receiving Sacraments. Our Primary 6 and 7 pupils participate in the Pope Francis Faith Award programme and we continue to engage with Laudato Si, putting our faith in action to protect our world.

Gospel values are embedded within our school values and aims. As we look towards Advent it is again with the focus on being kind, caring and serving others.
