#### School App

Can I also remind parents/carers that school starts at 8.55am daily, it is important your child is in the school line for this time.

As you are aware the whole school are going to the matinee performance of 'The Lion King' on Wednesday 15th January 2020 at Edinburgh Playhouse. <u>If you chose to pay by instalments we ask you to continue</u> with this as payment must be received in full no later than Friday 15th November. Cost per child is £20.

Our new children and all Primary 1 children should now have received a letter with all the details, please contact the school office if you did not receive this.

# Breakfast Club

The Breakfast Club runs from 8.15am daily and costs  $\pounds$ 1 per day. Primary 1 to Primary 3 children and also children entitled to free school meals do not pay for this service. The children will be allowed to play outside from 8.45am when the janitor will join them to supervise. Our Breakfast Club is supervised for children using this service, we <u>do not</u> have supervision for children being dropped off at school before 8.45am.

# Dinner Money

A number of children have outstanding money due for school dinners/breakfast club. This is not only additional work for school staff but can cause upset and embarrassment to your child. Please check your child's account and ensure there is sufficient funds on a daily basis. Should you require password for online payments please contact school office. If you think you may be eligible for free school meals please contact school office. Should you wish to discuss this further please contact Mrs Oates.

#### School Security

The safety and security of your children is our priority at all times, the following school procedures are in place to ensure the safety of your children.

- Latecoming please encourage your child to come to the school office if they are late even if only by a few minutes, your child could be marked off on the register and an absence text sent out, this can be distressing to the parent.
- School Bus/School Taxi we now have 35 children entitled to school transport, we ask you to contact the school office by 2pm if you have a change to your arrangements as this is a great help to our staff who everyday ensure your child is where they should be at 3.00pm.
- Clydesdale After School Club please contact CASC and school by 2pm if you have a change to your arrangements, sometimes there can be confusion and young children are not always sure of where they are going.

#### Hair Checking

Once a Week - Take a Peek - Please check your child's hair on a regular basis. Treatment can be prescribed by your doctor or bought from your local chemist. It is advisable for children with long hair to wear it tied back.
