Getting Started with Duolingo



For now, we will be learning online. To help you learn more about reading, writing and speaking in French or Spanish, your teacher may set some tasks for you on Duolingo for Schools. Here are some tips to help you get started.

1. Logging In

Click [here](#) to head to the Duolingo for Schools website from the internet browser of any device.

Click 'Login' and enter the username and password shared by your teacher.

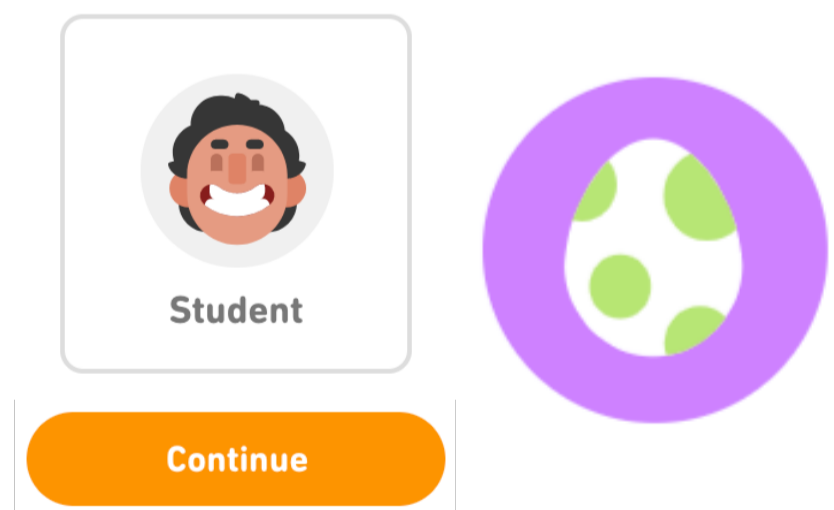
Afterwards, click 'Log in with Duolingo account'.
