CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT PARENT COUNCIL ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING SAINT BRENDAN'S PRIMARY SCHOOL AND NURSERY CLASS

Tuesday 5th September 2023, 6pm

The Parent Council met formally on six occasions over session 2022/23.

A key change to Parent Council operations was the development of our Social Media Strategy in partnership with our Parent Fundraising group. The aim of this was to improve communication with the parent forum. A twitter account and a facebook account have now been set up as part of this strategy.

Many discussions took place regarding the cost of the school day and particularly, school uniform. For the second year in a row, the Parent Council issued an informative newsletter to parents/carers to provide information and options to help reduce uniform costs. The Parent Council have also stressed their support of the clothing bank in the school and how this supports the Eco schools agenda.

As in previous years, the Parent Council have continued to raise concerns about pupil safety as a result of parking and traffic around the school with North Lanarkshire Council, the police and other elected representatives. Although a solution is yet to be found; the Parent Council continues to be active in further pushing this agenda to ensure the safety of our children.

The detailed Head Teacher report continues to be a key part of Parent Council meetings. The Parent Council appreciate key information about school improvement priorities, events and staffing being shared. For example, the Parent Council were delighted that the school achieved the Silver Rights Respecting Schools Award. The Parent Council has been consulted on a wide range of issues like the School Improvement Plan and Pupil Equity Fund spending.

A highlight of the year was the HMIe Report. The Parent Council and many members of the Parent Forum contributed to this process. Inspectors noted that more parents than normal wanted to be part of focus groups. It was noted that parents were exceptionally pleased with the quality of education and support for their children. The Parent Council were delighted with the outcome of the inspection and congratulated the

staff for their hard work. Since the inspection, the HT has kept the school updated on how action points are being addressed through the School Improvement Plan. The Parent Council are particularly pleased that a plan has been put in place to address action points identified for the nursery.

Session 2022/23 was a year in which 'normality' returned to the school in terms of community events being planned. The Parent Council appreciated consultation about these events and continuously thanked the school staff for providing such opportunities for their children. In particular, the Summer Concert and Summer Fayre were highlights of the school year.

Overall, 2022/23 continued to be a year where the Parent Council worked in partnership with the school to ensure the best decisions for the children were made.
