St Helen's Primary School opened its doors to staff and pupils in session 1973/74—and since then it has been a central part of Condorrat. The school have chosen to celebrate this milestone during this session 2024/25 and we have planned a range of events—the events colour coded in **Blue** are open to parents to attend:

**Memory Lane**—on Parents' Night pop into our GP Room and take a walk down memory lane. We have searched high and low and gathered together all the photographs we could find. ### **Tribute Mass celebrated by His Grace Archbishop Nolan — 1.30pm on the 16th May 2025**

The school community—staff, parents and children are invited to gather in Our Lady and St Helen's along with some invited guests. Tea and coffee will be served afterwards in the school with another opportunity to view our Memory Lane display.

**Commemorative Assembly/Alumni Event—9th May 2025 at 1.30pm** - this will be held for in the hall and will be an opportunity to hear from some current and former pupils or staff members of St Helen's with some songs sung by the children.

**50 Acts of Kindness**— this will be introduced after the Easter Holidays with the children being asked to undertake 50 acts of kindness aligned with the school aims and values

**Commemorative Yearbook Edition**—All children will feature in a special 50th edition of a yearbook. These will be presented to the children in May 2025 and can be a keepsake for the children and alumni.

**Family Ceilidh/Bingo night to celebrate the 50th Anniversary—Friday 6th June.** Parents are invited to come along with their children to join with staff to celebrate our 50th Anniversary in the hall with some ceilidh and group dancing, bingo, refreshments and snacks. This will be a ticketed event held at the following times—6.30pm—7.30pm and 8pm—9pm. Tickets will be £5 per family sold on a first come first served basis from Monday 28th April

**St Helen's has Talent**— St Helen's is bursting with talent and the children love the opportunity to show these off—so what could be better than a talent show for the children to attend. This will be organised for Thursday 22nd May 2025.

**Community Event**—The children will share their talents with members of our community by visiting the Church Hall to entertain the Parishioners after 10am Mass. This will take place on Friday 30th May with some acts from the talent show and a dance display from our Dance Mania Show dancers.

**School Trip with Commemorative Merchandise**—A whole school trip to Blairdrummond Safari Park has been organised for Friday 13th June. All children and staff will be wearing commemorative baseball caps—designed by the children. The School Fund will absorb the cost of this trip.

Our annual Daffodil Tea will be held on Friday 21st March at 2pm with all monies raised going towards our Lenten Charities.



The children will have the opportunity to purchase bunches of daffodils in the morning for £1 a bunch.

In the afternoon at 2pm—parents and carers are welcome to join us—to purchase a bunch of daffodils, have a tea or coffee and enjoy hearing the children perform some springtime songs.

## UNIFORM POLICY

St. Helen's Primary prides itself on our uniform policy—and visitors to the school frequently comment on how smart our children look in their blue shirts and ties, navy jumpers and grey skirts/pinafores or trousers with black shoes or black trainers.

Recently, I have seen a small number of children present to school wearing branded, coloured hoodies that are not aligned with our uniform policy. Please can these be kept for weekend wear or non-uniform days.

Any child wearing a jumper or hoodie which is not in keeping with our school uniform colours will be asked to remove it.

Similarly, please can you ensure that children are wearing black trainers or shoes to school—and keep coloured footwear for the weekend.

## WORLD BOOK DAY

World Book Day will be celebrated on Thursday 6th March. There will be activities across the school to promote a love for reading.

Children are invited to dress up as a character from a book, or wear a piece of head gear or bring a prop that links with a character from a book or alternatively bring in their favourite book to tell the class about it.

Some members of our school community are visiting the school to read a story to each class and the children will be given a free book.



## SMART WATCHES

It has come to our attention that a number of children are wearing SMART watches to school with the capacity for taking pictures and making calls. Please be advised that taking unauthorised pictures of children or staff is a direct breach of GDPR practices. Any child engaging in this activity will be asked to remove their watch—and parents will be contacted to collect it from the school.

As per our mobile phones policy—children should not be using these watches to make calls during the school day. Again—if this is the case, children will be asked to remove their watch and parents will be contacted to collect it from the school.

I can see the many educational benefits of these devices, however children need to be of an age to understand the responsible code of conduct required when wearing such a device to school. We appreciate your support with this.
