Dear Parents, Carers and Friends of St Helen's,

It's been great to have such a sunny start to the term and I hope you have all had a lovely summer.

The children are looking refreshed and raring to go and it is good to see them all looking so smart in their school uniform. Thank you for your continued support with this.

Our Primary ones are settling really well and Mrs Marshall is enjoying getting to know them. The boys and girls in Primary 7 have been a fantastic support to the Primary ones and they are taking on all the additional responsibilities that come with being at the top of the school with great enthusiasm.

Throughout the school there is a sense of calm and the children have all adjusted back into the school routines and expectations.

As the PE timetable gets up and running keep an eye on the Class Teams page for details of the PE days. On these days the children should bring their PE kit to change into—navy joggers, leggings or shorts and a yellow polo top. Primaries 1 and 2 can wear their yellow polo top to school on PE days with their jogging bottoms/leggings or shorts in their bag to change into.

If a class has PE first thing in the morning—at 9am—they are permitted to come to school in their PE kits but must bring their uniforms in their bag to change into.

This session we have two new staff members who have joined our team—Mrs Prior and Miss Pacitti. We extend a warm welcome to them both.

SACRAMENTS

Mrs Ferguson will send out correspondence about the Sacraments this year—specifically:

- Reconciliation—Primary 3
- First Holy Communion—Primary 4
- Confirmation—Primary 7

The sacrament of Reconciliation in Primary 3 is the first Sacrament the school are involved in preparing the children for. **Children must be Baptised** in order to receive this Sacrament. Therefore if your child is not yet Baptised and you would like them to make the Sacrament of Reconciliation please speak to Fr. Paulinus at Our Lady and St. Helen's Parish or your own Parish Priest if you attend another Church.

The preparation lessons for the Reconciliation usually begin around January/February—so parents are advised to make arrangements to have children Baptised sooner rather than later as Priests can be busy.




FLU VACCINE

Consent forms for children to receive the annual flu vaccine were sent home on 20th August—so please check your child's bag. Please complete the form and return it to the school as soon as possible.

NHS Nursing Teams will be in the school on Monday 27th of October to administer the flu vaccine.

The flu vaccine will not be given to any child who does not return a completed consent form.

You will have a chance to hear more about our improvement plans for the year and our whole school community Fridays initiative. There will also be Isome helpful hints and tips from the teachers.


MEDICINES

There may be occasions when children require medication during the school day, and the school is happy to assist with this.

However, please note that a medicine form <u>needs</u> to be completed before any medication can be administered.

Medicine forms will be renewed at the start of each session. Correspondence regarding this has been emailed to all parents along with a medicine form. If you wish your child's administration of medication to continue from last session—this form needs to be completed and **returned by Friday 29th August**.

After this date any medication that is held in the school that is not supported by a current form will be sent home.



TEAMS

Teams will continue to be used to post homework details. All children in the school have been allocated to a class Team—so please ensure you are able to access this at home.

Details of PE days and any information relevant to your child's class will be posted on Teams.

Please note—teachers are assessing children and carrying out some revision work, therefore formal homework will not commence until after Sept weekend.

There is also a whole school Team entitled School News and Updates. Prior to the start of the week the school will post a 'WOTW' - What's On This Week—which is a timetable detailing any school events that are taking place over the course of the week. Parents have indicated this is helpful so make sure you can access this and contact the school if you require any

RIGHTS RESPECTING SCHOOL

We shared the good news with the children this week that we have earned our bronze RRS award showing our commitment to upholding the UNCRC. We are now working towards having silver award status—so watch this space. Our thanks goes to Mrs Purdue and the RRS Committee for their hard work.

PATRONAL FEAST DAY

We will celebrate the feast day of St Helen as the founder of the cross on Friday 12th Sept. The actual feast day of the Exaltation of the Cross is on Sunday 14th September. There will be a special Mass celebrated in the school for the children followed by some fun activities in the afternoon.

Fr Paulinus has advised that moving forward the Parish will be celebrating the Feast of St Helen on the 20th August. So from next session the school will also mark this date as our Patronal Feast Day.

NUT ALLERGIES

Please be aware we have children with severe nut allergies. This can lead to reactions which vary in severity and in some cases would result in anaphylaxis and require an ambulance.

To help mitigate this risk please ensure children do not bring any snacks or lunch products to school that contain nuts.

Products that are prohibited are:

Kinder Bueno

Chicken Satay Skewers

Nutty cereal bars

Chocolate spread such as Nutella

If a child comes to school with any products that contain nuts you will be contacted and the items will be removed and placed in the outside bins as airborne particles and trigger an allergic reaction.

Please check the ingredients of all snacks before sending them into school.

CAR PARKING

The school car park is not very big and cannot accommodate the cars of parents, school and nursery staff, school buses, taxis for children funded by the Authority and cars belonging to visiting agencies who support children.

For safety reasons, due to the volume of traffic, we ask that parents/carers do not use the school car park between the hours of 8.30am and 3.30pm to allow safe access for school transport, school staff and agencies who are providing a service for the children.

Please can you ensure that any other family members such as Grandparents who do drop offs or pick ups are aware of this information

There is plenty of parking in the streets surrounding the school. However I would urge parents to show consideration to residents and park responsibly. We have received complaints in the past from residents about parking— one resident was blocked in her car parking space and as a result was late for her work.


As a school community we do not want to upset or inconvenience local residents—so please be a thoughtful and considerate parker.

PERSONAL LEARNING PLANS— (PLPs)

In St Helen's all school children will have a Personal Learning Plan. This will be sent home to you twice over the session—firstly on the 6th October—and will remain home until Friday 10th Oct and then again in January 2026. There will be no homework issued that week to allow time to read it through with your child. We believe that all children and young people should have frequent and regular opportunities to discuss their learning with an adult who knows them well and can act as a mentor, helping them to set appropriate goals for the next stages in learning. Children should be at the centre of this planning, as active participants in their learning and development.

The PLP outlines the Curriculum for Excellence level your child is working on in Literacy and Numeracy and specific targets that have been set for your child through discussion with the Class Teacher. Curriculum for Excellence is structured in levels to cover learning for children from 3 – 18. Throughout the time in Primary school children may progress through Early Level, First Level and Second Level. The path most children and young people are expected to follow through the levels reflects the stages of maturation of children and young people and the changing ways in which they engage with learning as they develop.

The diagram below shows the five curriculum levels:



Some children and young people will start learning at these levels earlier and others later, depending upon individual needs and aptitudes. The Class Teacher will have discussions with your child about their learning in order to complete the Personal Learning Plan. As the year progresses the personal learning plan will outline the following information:

- An indication of the Curriculum for Excellence levels your child is working on in the 3 aspects of Literacy –
 Reading, Writing, and Listening and Talking
- An indication of the Curriculum for Excellence level your child is working on in Mathematics
- Specific targets that have been set for your child from Oct Jan and February June

In addition to the information on Literacy and Numeracy, the Personal Learning Plan also documents targets for Health and Wellbeing which along with Literacy and Numeracy, is a core area of the curriculum.

Enclosed in the Personal Learning Plan is an explanation of each of the SHANARRI wellbeing indicators for parents to read and then talk about with their child. Parents are then asked to specify a Health and Wellbeing Target which will be focused on at home.

It is hoped the Personal Learning Plan will act as a tool for learning conversations with children to ensure each child feels like an active participant in their learning. The plan is designed to be a working document that can strengthen the home and school partnership. There are full instruction in the PLP for parents to follow.

SNAPSHOT JOTTERS

Snapshot Jotters are a further way to help to strengthen the partnership between home and school by sharing learning and encouraging ongoing communication.

Snapshot Jotters are used periodically by the children for one week at a time. The purpose is to capture a snapshot of learning across the curriculum.

The Snapshot jotters will then be sent home to parents/carers so that you can see your child's achievements, talk about some of the learning that has taken place and over the year see how this progresses.

Snapshot Jotters will be sent home on the following dates—and should be returned to school within the week:

- Monday 6th October 2025
- Monday 1st December 2025
- Available at Parents' Night on 19th March 2026
- Monday 8th June 2025

There will be no formal homework set for children when Snapshot Jotters are sent home to allow time for discussion.

PARENT COUNCIL

We have a fantastic Parent Council who work so hard to fundraise for the school, organise events for the children and support events arranged by the school.

Linsay McCallum is the Chair of the PC—and there is a Facebook page which has a wealth of information.

The first meeting of the Parent Council is on Tuesday 16th Sep at 6.30pm in the school staffroom. This is a great opportunity to meet other parents and get to know the school staff better.

COMMUNITY FRIDAYS

We are excited to launch a new whole-school initiative called Community Fridays, taking place on the first Friday of each month. These special days are designed to bring our school community together and enrich learning experiences beyond the classroom.

Each Community Friday will include a range of meaningful activities such as:

- Attending Mass
- Participating in pupil committees
- Engaging in outdoor learning
- Gathering for assembly
- Taking part in Thinking Circles to share and value pupil voice

Community Fridays reflect our school's
Curriculum Rationale and are firmly rooted in the
Four Capacities of Curriculum for Excellence —
helping children to become Successful Learners,
Confident Individuals, Responsible Citizens, and
Effective Contributors. They also embrace the
Four Contexts for Learning, creating
opportunities for rich experiences across
curriculum areas, personal achievement,
interdisciplinary learning, and the wider life of
the school.

We look forward to seeing the positive impact these Fridays will have on our learners and the school community.
