Dear Parents/Carers and friends of St. John Paul II,

On 19th June 2020, North Lanarkshire Council published new guidance to school staff and all Parents/Carers on what the opening of schools will be like in August 2020. It is fair to say that our new term in August will look nothing like any other start to a new school year we have ever experienced.

We are aware that there is a lot for Parents/Carers to consider and much of the decisions you make depend on decisions made by North Lanarkshire Council regarding educational provision for your child or children.

I have prepared this newsletter for you - it will be part of a series of newsletters/publications to support you and try to reassure you about what you can expect and what we are doing to prepare to welcome the children back in August.

There are some questions we will simply not be able to answer yet, either because we are awaiting more information from the Scottish Government or North Lanarkshire Council, or because we haven't quite worked out exactly what we can and cannot do about a particular issue.

The information in this Newsletter is offered as a starting point. It will help you to get your own head around certain things and it will help you to begin to talk as a family about school and what the new school year holds for our children.

Rest assured that our staff have been working every day - in the midst of preparing and providing daily online digital learning as well as supporting the Hub - to work things out and make sensible plans to reassure you and to try and make things as easy as possible for all of our families.

The plans which have been put in place by NLC will no doubt not suit everyone and every circumstance. Our building has been changed to maximise classroom space. Our classes are mostly full due to the 50% and 2m rules. Therefore, it will only be possible to accommodate changes if another family is willing to swap. If I can accommodate things to support you, I will. However, I cannot guarantee this and I cannot accommodate every request for every family.

Things are constantly changing and even some of the plans which are already in place may have to change as we move forward to what we hope will be a return to normality in the not too distant future.

ANSWERING SOME OF YOUR IMMEDIATE QUESTIONS

Since the announcement from North Lanarkshire about a *Blended Model of in school and home learning* on 8th June, we have had many questions put to us on social media, via email and over the phone. Thank you for listening to our messages asking for some time to digest the information and prepare some answers for you. I continue to ask you for your patience and your understanding. If we do not have an answer, we cannot offer one. Very often, our answers depend on information from NLC or the Scottish Government and so we need to move at a pace which takes this into account!



We have no secrets to keep from you! We will share information we have with you as soon as we can. However, sometimes the answers may not be given within a timeframe that suits every individual family, but we will try!

I ask you to remember that our staff are working in an ever-changing and pressured set of circumstances, just like many of you! Therefore, let's approach each other with respect, understanding and patience.



THE MODEL FOR PRIMARY SCHOOLS - *What this means at St. JPII*

Children will attend school for 2 days per week with 10 hours of direct teaching and learning offered as well as a continuation of Digital Home Learning

In order to have social distancing in place (2m) we can only have 50% of our children in each day. This has meant that we have had to change the layout of the school.

A lot of work has already gone into assessing our accommodation within the school. We will have to utilise some additional space in the school in order to achieve this. For example the Music Room and Treehouse.

You will receive a letter with your child's class, their Class Teacher and their allocated days to attend school. This letter will also include your child's report (from last term) which was prepared before Lockdown.

Group A will attend on Monday & Tuesday
Group B will attend on Thursday & Friday.
Wednesday mornings will be for Keyworker children with afternoons for staff non-class contact time.

Children will be split into two groups, A & B, with 50% in each group. We will allocate **Families (siblings only)** to the same group for ease of planning for families. We will have 16 classes (as we did last year) and each class will have an allocated Teacher or Teachers.

Initially, children will participate in a core curriculum of Literacy, Numeracy and some Health & Wellbeing. As we are a Catholic School, there will be a small amount of RE.

More detail will emerge over the coming weeks about how this will look for us and we will continue to communicate with you throughout the Summer Holidays. North Lanarkshire Council has an agreed process for sharing information and messages with families and we, as a school, are guided by this. We can only share with you what we know!

NLC are working with all schools to ensure that buildings are as safe as they can possibly be with lots of preparation taking place between now and August. Clear signage, social distancing measures and hand hygiene routines will be in place.

WILL THE CHILDREN BE WEARING UNIFORM?



The short answer to this question is... **"YES!"**

One of the things we are all looking forward to is a return to routine and normality. The most normal thing about coming to school, is wearing uniform. It sends a clear message to everyone that when we come to school, things are different than they are when we are at home.

- ◆ We can begin to re-create the sense of identity and pride in our school.
- ◆ We can show our new Primary 1 children what it means to be part of our school.
- ◆ With a blended model of learning, where some learning days will be at home, we can ensure our children are in the right frame of mind when coming to school for direct teaching.

WHAT SHOULD MY CHILD WEAR?

Our school uniform is quite simple:

- ◆ Light blue shirt, school tie, black trousers/skirt/pinafore.
- ◆ Girls can wear BLUE CHECKED summer dresses if they wish.
- ◆ There is no requirement to wear branded items such as sweatshirts or polo shirts.
- ◆ If you are concerned about your child wearing a school tie, or are unable to buy one for the start of term, then please do not worry about this!

PLEASE DO NOT BRING PERSONAL BELONGINGS TO SCHOOL

Everything your child will need for school will be provided. We have already begun to make up individual packs for every child with a selection of resources. These include jotters, colouring pens, pencils, rubber, sharpener, whiteboard and marker, scissors, glue stick. This will help with infection control!

Children should not bring toys, pencil cases or other personal belongings to school.

SHOULD MY CHILD BRING A SCHOOL BAG WITH THEM?

Yes—children can bring a bag to school. However, please try to keep them as small as possible! These will be hanging on the back of their chair in the class, along with their jackets as we cannot ensure social distancing in the cloakrooms. Packed Lunch Boxes should also be as small as possible.

PLEASE ENSURE THAT YOUR CHILD IS DRESSED APPROPRIATELY FOR THE WEATHER. ENTRY TO THE SCHOOL WILL NOT BE PERMITTED BEFORE THE BELL RINGS UNFORTUNATELY.

LUNCH

There will be a limited menu on offer each day with **ONE hot choice** or a Snack to Go. Children with a packed lunch or Snack to Go will eat their lunch in the classroom or outside on a nice day. Only children who are having a hot lunch will be permitted to go to the dining hall. This is to minimize the amount of movement around the school and obviously to ensure that we do not waste valuable learning and teaching time when the children are in school!

PLEASE NOTE - No cash can be brought into school and therefore all payments for school lunches will need to be made using the online payment facility. All children in P1-3 are entitled to a Free School Meal. Children in P4-P7 are entitled if their Parents/Carers have applied for Free School Meals.

WHAT TO EXPECT WHEN YOU ARRIVE AT

SCHOOL IN AUGUST...


- ◆ The pedestrian gates which you use to enter and exit the campus will operate slightly differently. The one **nearest the roundabout will be ENTRY ONLY** and the one **nearest the crossing patrol will be EXIT ONLY**.
- ◆ Your child(ren) will be allocated a gate through which to enter the playground. They must only use this gate.
- ◆ Each child will be allocated a zone in their playground (colour –coded) with their classmates. This will be next to the entrance door they will use to gain access to the building.
- ◆ A staggered start and finish time will be allocated to each HOUSE GROUP. This is so that families can arrive together and to minimise congestion in the grounds. Your school start and finish time is indicated in the packs you have been issued.
- ◆ Signage and floor markings will guide children to various zones and we will operate a 'keep left' system in the building to ensure social distancing.
- ◆ Parents/Carers will not be permitted within the school grounds or into the building unfortunately. This is not how we normally operate! We have a very welcoming ethos and an open door policy. However, you can always keep in touch with us and we are happy to chat to you on the phone until such times as we can welcome you in person again!


NURSERY TRANSITION TO P1

Please note that after the Summer Holiday, children will not be permitted to use the 'top up' machines to put money into their lunch accounts. All money will have to be added using the online payment system. We will re-issue instructions in August on how to use this.
