CATHOLIC EDUCATION WEEK 2021 Celebrating and Worshipping

Each year, Catholic Education week can be celebrated between the feast of St. Margaret (16th Nov.) and the feast of St. Andrew (30th Nov.) During this period, we are always given a theme to focus on and this year the theme is 'Celebrating and Worshipping'. As a faith community, this theme is something which permeates the entire school year. We celebrate and worship every day through our regular prayer and liturgy. We have a calendar of events throughout the year to bring us together in celebration and worship. On the Feast of St. Andrew, we had a Day of Adoration. This was led by our Pope Francis Faith Award Children with every class spending some time in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament in the hall, which became our chapel for the day!

WELCOME TO OUR SCHOOL!

We welcome Mrs Bowman to our staff team. Mrs Bowman will be with us each Thursday and Friday as an Additional Support Needs Assistant. We hope that she feels very much part of our school community. She is already getting to know the children and staff.



ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

I have heard from a number of sources that young people, from a variety of schools in the area, are causing a disturbance in the community and targeting homes by kicking doors and throwing eggs at windows and doors. I have also been informed of children throwing stones a cars and other vehicles. Whilst the incidents happen outside school hours, it is concerning to think that any pupil from St. John Paul II could be doing this.



You may remember that we had a few incidents of vandalism within school grounds last year. I cooperated with Mrs Ferrie at Tannochside Primary and this seemed to stop.

I have been in touch with the Safer Communities Team at Police Scotland and have invited them into school. This work will initially be aimed at our senior pupils. Obviously, the vast majority of our children are not involved in these issues, however it is a good thing for everyone to participate in. This means we have a clear message and a clear focus on anti-social behaviour in the hope that the message of community spirit and respect for others might encourage our young people to make good decisions.

I ask all parents/carers to consider whether their child might know something about this, or might even have participated in it. Please do what you can in support of the local community. Please report anything that occurs to the Police.

SCHOOL MEAL PAYMENTS

A growing number of children in P5, P6 and P7 do not have sufficient funds in their iPayment accounts to cover school lunches. In fact, too many owe a large amount of money in unpaid lunches. For some, this is well over £100. This amounts up to hundreds of pounds and the school does not have any funds available to write this off. We will contact Parents/Carers via Text to let them know if there is an outstanding balance. A school lunch costs £3.10 per day. If you are struggling to pay the amount back, please contact Mr Thomas so that we can support you. If your child was entitled to a Free School Meal in P4, please reapply for P5. You have to apply at the start of **every school year.** If you need any further advice, please do contact Mr Thomas.

Children are given a small slip and we make as little fuss as possible so as not to embarrass the children if they do not have sufficient funds. Again, please do contact Mr Thomas if this is a particular problem for you so that we know and can support.

We are looking for Jumpers of varying sizes. You can send them into school from now and we will wash them and arrange for them to be distributed. Often, children forget

their own jumper, and so if we have a small stock, we can always ensure nobody is left out.

SMART SCHOOL COUNCIL

This year, we have signed up to be affiliated with the Smart School Council movement.
This is an initiative which is designed to increase Pupil Voice in the school. It is



designed to ensure that all children are encouraged to share their views and that children have a say in the ongoing improvement of the school.

Each week, the children will have a class meeting, which is led by a member of the Communication Team. Once decisions are made based on the opinions of the children, the Action Team will take forward suggestions and improvements the children have identified.

Each week, *The Big Debate* covers a different topic and children will be encouraged to debate these topics and issues. This may be in class, or it may be as part of their homework. So, be ready to take part!



IT'S GETTING COLDER OUT THERE!

This week the temperatures have taken a dip, especially in the morning. Even with the winter sun, parts of the

playground and pitch can be colder than others because of the shade, or because the area is exposed and has no shelter.

Please ensure your child has a warm jacket and perhaps a hat, scarf and gloves to wear. As you know, we are trying to ensure that the children are outdoors where possible. PE lessons are all outdoors (weather permitting). Sometimes the children get caught in the rain if a heavy downpour comes on and other times they are outside if it is only slightly wet. A waterproof would also be helpful.

On 16th December, no other options will be available for the children to order, other than Christmas Lunch. If your child does not wish to have a Christmas Lunch, you should provide a Packed Lunch for them.

Please ensure that your child has enough money in their online account to pay for their lunch.

Children will be permitted to wear a Christmas

Jumper as part of their school uniform on this day, or add something 'Christmassy' to their uniform should they wish.



CHRISTMAS PARTIES

We are planning to have Christmas Parties for the children this year. These will be parties involving one stage (Nursery, P1, P2, etc.) each day.

On your child's day, the arrangements will be as follows:

- Children should attend in the morning (in school uniform) as normal.
- Children can go home at lunchtime to change for their party and have lunch.
- Those going home will be dismissed at 12:15pm through the main gate (no earlier). All children should be collected by an adult.
- Children should return to school by 1:20pm. If they return earlier, they may need to play in the playground as there will be no supervision indoors unless it is raining.
- Those not going home, will remain in school as normal and have their lunch. Staff will help children change for their party.

HEADLICE

I have been contacted recently regarding headlice in a couple of classes. I wanted to give you a reminder of what happens and what the NHS guidance is on treating headlice. *Gone are the days where a routine letter informing Parents/Carers of a headlice outbreak is circulated.* There are quite clear reasons for this, not least that we could be sending out regular letters and this may encourage routine treatment as a preventative measure. This does not stop your child getting headlice!

Mrs Bradley has recently stepped down from her position as Breakfast Club Supervisor. Firstly, I would like to sincerely thank Mrs Bradley for her many years of service to the Breakfast Club. She has been the person to welcome so many of our children who come early to school as part of the Breakfast Club and she has always strived to ensure that the children have an enjoyable and welcoming atmosphere to have breakfast in. She has done this with the care and wellbeing of our children at heart and it has been greatly appreciated by our staff team as well as, I am sure, many of our families who make such good use of the Breakfast Club. Mrs Bradley is still with us! She is still working in her main role as Classroom Assistant.

Until such times as we can find a replacement for Mrs Bradley (as if we could ever!) I will be supervising the Breakfast Club. This may mean that you see me a little less at the gate in the mornings, but I will do my best to be out there once the Breakfast Club has been dismissed.

If you are interested in making use of the Breakfast Club but are not sure what it entails...

The breakfast consists of cereal, milk and toast. This is free to pupils who are in Primary 1 to 4 and for pupils in Primary 5 to 7 who receive free school meals. For all other pupils the cost is £1 per day with a sliding scale for families of two at £1.50 per day and families of three at £1.80 per day.

Breakfast Club opens at 8:15am and service stops at 8:50am. Children can arrive at any time from 8:15am.

ANTI BULLYING WEEK

15th - 19th November 2021

The children have been involved in lessons and activities for Anti-Bullying Week. This year, the theme is "One kind word." It explores the fact that, if we use one kind word, it can often lead to another, and another, and another! Each day, we encourage the children to be kind and respectful of themselves, others and property. Sometimes, as we know, children can find this difficult. It is important for us all... Parents/Carers and Teachers, to send out the right message, a united message about bullying and

respect for other people. It is important that we teach our children that our words and our actions can be hurtful.

PELICAN CROSSING - OLD EDINBURGH ROAD

cross the road. It is situated directly outside the church. Whilst there is still a lollipop crossing patrol at the beginning and end of the day, please do take some time to explain to the children how to use this. We will also mention this in school.

Please note: As St. John Paul II is a Roman Catholic Primary School, Parents/Carers children who are Baptised Catholic should provide a Baptismal Certificate.

ENROLMENT FOR NURSERY

As with last year, Parents/Carers wishing to enroll their child for Nursery, will be required to do so online.

Information will be emailed to Parents/Carers by North Lanarkshire Council and we will also email the relevant information to our current Parents/Carers.

Please note: There are strict guidelines for the allocation of places in all NLC Nurseries and you should read over this information on the NLC website. Supporting documents should be supplied with the application.

Some reminders as we continue our efforts to keep our school COVID-19 safe

Things are changing/easing in many settings (restaurants/pubs/theatres, etc.) but for schools, many of the restrictions are still in place. We need your help to keep children, staff and everyone as safe as possible.



THE ONE WAY SYSTEM IS NO LONGER IN OPERATION

We ask you to ensure you give others space around the school gates by keeping them clear. Encourage the children to exit via the safest gate with less roads to cross.

OUR ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL ARRANGEMENTS:

School will now start for <u>ALL CHILDREN at 9am</u>. The gates will be open and children can enter the playground (no supervision before 8:45am). The mornings are generally more quiet as people arrive at different times. Children are invited inside at 8:50am. **From Monday 6th December** at the end of the school

Children will continue to be dismissed at 2:50pm however, the second group of children will be dismissed at 3pm (instead of 3:05pm).

We will continue to dismiss children from their current gate for the time being (Main/Pitch/Dining Hall). Please try to stay away until your allocated time, maintain a safe distance from others and vacate the car park ASAP. The car park may be busier at the end of the day, so please consider parking elsewhere.

KEEP A SAFE DISTANCE FROM OTHER HOUSEHOLDS WHEN DROPPING OFF AND COLLECTING CHILDREN

One Adult only (per family) should be within the school grounds.





WEAR A FACE COVERING AT DROP OFF/COLLECTION TIMES PLEASE WEAR THESE ON PAVEMENTS AROUND AND WITHIN THE SCHOOL/GATES Any member of the public entering our building MUST wear a face covering.
