CATHOLIC EDUCATION WEEK 2022 Communion, Participation and Mission

Each year, Catholic Education week can be celebrated between the feast of St. Margaret (16th Nov.) and the feast of St. Andrew (30th Nov.) During this period, we are always given a theme to focus on and this year the theme is *'Communication, Participation and Mission'*. These three words are taken from the ongoing Synod which has been called by our Holy Father, Pope Francis.



Pope Francis' reflection on the Opening of Synodal Path. The Holy Father said that: "Nothing leaves Jesus indifferent; everything is of concern to him. Encountering faces, meeting eyes, sharing history. That is the closeness that Jesus embodies. He knows that someone's life can be changed by a single encounter. The Gospel is full of such encounters with Christ, encounters that uplift and bring healing. Jesus did not hurry along or keep looking at his watch to get the meeting over. He was always at the service of the person he was with, listening to what he or she had to say."

Our school community is a witness to the Gospel in many ways:

- The liturgical and sacramental life of the school is part of our annual calendar. Not only this, we try to ensure that our children and school community experience the best liturgy - prayerful, joyful and uplifting.



Children will be permitted to wear a Christmas Jumper as part of their school uniform on this day, or add something 'Christmassy' to their uniform should they wish.




CHRISTMAS PARTIES

Here are the arrangements for Christmas Parties. Dates are included later in the newsletter.

On your child's day, the arrangements will be as follows:

- Children should attend in the morning (in school uniform) as normal.
- Children can go home at lunchtime to change for their party and have lunch.
- Those going home will be dismissed at 12:15pm through the main gate (no earlier). All children should be collected by an adult.
- Children should return to school for 1:20pm. If they return earlier, they may need to play in the playground as there will be no supervision indoors unless it is raining.
- Those not going home, will remain in school as normal and have their lunch. Staff will help children change for their party.

PLEASE KEEP POLLUTION TO A MINIMUM

Very often, when parents/carers are waiting to collect children or waiting to put them into the Breakfast Club, they sit with their engine running. There are so many reasons why we should not do this.

Some of you will remember the project we carried out with Ash Scotland a year or two ago. We signed



up to Scotland's Charter for a Tobacco Free Generation by 2034. This partnership led to our P7s creating the slogan, 'Don't smoke in front of folk!' Their campaign was to stop Parents and Carers from smoking around the school gate.

Recently, it has become clear that adults are once again smoking at the school gate and it is not only cigarettes which are being smoked.

The smell is clearly not shop bought cigarettes! We ask you to please refrain from any smoking on school grounds or around the school gate where others have to pass by. Thank you for your support with this.

LOST PROPERTY

We have recently sorted through every item of lost property (AGAIN!) This was a huge undertaking, due to the sheer amount of items which are left behind in school.

I realise that this is frustrating for Parents/Carers, but it is also frustrating for us. It takes a lot of our time and energy to try and stay on top of this. I would ask that you do the following:

- Label everything that belongs to your child—
 with a permanent marker! Make sure you do
 this for new items throughout the year.
- Encourage your child to take responsibility for their belongings. Ensure they know what is theirs!

Anything with a child's name on it has been returned to them. Other items will be on display at Parents' Night. Please take anything you wish.

SCHOOL HOUSE SYSTEM

Each child in the school (and all staff members) are allocated to a house. Siblings are allocated to the same house (to save any rivalry!)

Our houses are named after places of pilgrimage - those associated with Our Lady. They are:

Knock (in Ireland), Lourdes (in France), Fatima (in Portugal), Guadeloupe (in South America) and Częstochowa (in Poland).

House tokens are issued throughout the week for a variety of positive things... behaviour, attitude, growth mindset, kindness, etc.

Our House Captains (P7) and Vice Captains (P6) have been leading our assemblies over the last few weeks and they are doing a wonderful job! They have also led their first House Meetings,

where children and staff gathered in their own groups.

Houses are working towards winning House Tokens to win a special treat at the end of the school year.





IT'S GETTING COLDER OUT THERE!

This week the temperatures have taken a dip, especially in the morning. Even with the winter sun, parts of the

playground and pitch can be colder than others because of the shade, or because the area is exposed and has no shelter.

Please ensure your child has a warm jacket and perhaps a hat, scarf and gloves to wear. In the run up to Christmas, when the stage is assembled in the gym hall, PE lessons are all outdoors (weather permitting). Sometimes the children get caught in the rain if a heavy downpour comes on and other times they are outside if it is only slightly wet. A waterproof would also be helpful.

Children's rights are learned, understood and lived in this school.

















Article 27 will be our focus for the month of December. This states that every child has the right to a good standard of living. The right to food, shelter, warmth and a good house to live in. It also states that children should be able to live in a way that helps them reach their full physical, mental, spiritual, moral and social potential.

PARENTS' NIGHT

CAR PARK

In the last few weeks, we have had a few incidents which have involved parents/carers from both St. John Paul II and Laburnum Family Learning Centre in the car park.

On all of these occasions, the incident has resulted in aggressive behaviour and swearing.

If this were an isolated incident, I would perhaps leave it to those involved. However, within two weeks, we have had around four incidents.

It is often suggested that it is the Head Teacher's responsibility to "sort" the car park. Whilst I take responsibility and make a lot of effort to encourage responsible behaviour and safe use of the car park, I cannot be expected to take responsibility for how people drive and how people react to each other under certain circumstances.

Regardless, it is completely inappropriate that children should be arriving at or leaving school and witnessing grown ups shouting and swearing at each other. We are **ALL** responsible for **OUR OWN ACTIONS!** I will continue to encourage everyone to be safe and courteous. Please do your bit if you use the car park.
